**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The M5 Motorway (Junctions 19 and 20 Slip Roads)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

*Made* - - - - - *28th March 2011*

*Coming into force* - - - - - *30th March 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway (“the M5”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on some of those connecting roads at Junctions 19 and 20 in North Somerset should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 19 and 20 Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 30th March 2011 and apply for a period of twelve months.

2. In this Order –

“the slip roads” mean (i) the northbound entry slip road at M5 Junction 19; (ii) the northbound entry slip road at M5 Junction 20; and (iii) the southbound entry slip road at M5 Junction 20;

“the works” mean litter picking, gully cleaning, sweeping, grass cutting, studs, barrier re-tensioning, road markings and general maintenance;

“a works period” means a period of 8½ hours starting at 21.00 hours on Friday 1st April 2011 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip roads.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

- (c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works or for winter maintenance purposes.
