The A20 Trunk Road (West of Courtwood Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A20 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A20 Trunk Road (West of Courtwood Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 7th May 2011.

2. In this Order:

"the trunk road" means the A20 Trunk Road near Folkestone in the County of Kent;

"lay-by" means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(**b**);

"the A20 lay-by" means the lay-by in the Londonbound carriageway of the trunk road 366 metres east of Capel Street overbridge west of Courtwood Interchange (B2011);

"works" mean sign replacement work on the trunk road; and

"the works period" means the period starting on Sunday 8th May 2011 and ending on 6th November 2012.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5 below, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in, or wait on, the A20 lay-by.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

5. Nothing in article 3 above shall apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or

(d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
