ROAD TRAFFIC

The A419 Trunk Road (South Cerney to Cricklade) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

 Made
 11th May 2011

 Coming into force
 18th May 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A419 Trunk Road ("the A419") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and some of those connecting roads near Cricklade in Wiltshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the A419 Trunk Road (South Cerney to Cricklade) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 18th May 2011.

2. In this Order -

"the A419" means the southbound carriageway of the A419 from the tip of the nosing of the southbound exit slip road at the South Cerney Junction to the tip of the nosing of the southbound entry slip road at the Cricklade Junction;

"the slip roads" mean (i) the A419 southbound entry slip road at the South Cerney Junction; (ii) the A419 southbound entry slip road at the Marston Meysey Junction; and (iii) the A419 southbound exit slip road at the Cricklade Junction;

"the works" mean waterproofing and surfacing maintenance works;

"a works period" means a period of 58 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Friday 20th May 2011 or any subsequent Friday and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A419 and the slip roads.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;

(b)	a vehicle	being	used	at	the	direction,	or	with	the	permission,	of	a	constable	or	traffic
	officer in uniform.														

(c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works.
