ROAD TRAFFIC

The A405 Trunk Road (M1 Junction 6 - M25 Junction 21A) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

 Made
 31st May 2011

 Coming into force
 18th June 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A405 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A405 Trunk Road (M1 Junction 6 - M25 Junction 21A) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 18th June 2011.

2. In this Order:

"the trunk road" means the A405 Trunk Road in the County of Hertfordshire;

"the length of carriageway" means the northbound carriageway of the trunk road from its junction with the M1 at Junction 6 to the roundabout at its junction with the M25 at Junction 21A;

"Chequers Lane" means the road known as Chequers Lane at its junction with the northbound carriageway of the trunk road;

"works" mean resurfacing, reconstruction, retexturing, road marking and road stud installation work on the trunk road; and

"the works period" means the period starting on 24th June 2011 and ending on 17th December 2012.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle -
 - (a) to enter or proceed in the length of carriageway; or
 - (b) to enter Chequers Lane from the trunk road or to enter the trunk road from Chequers Lane.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -
 - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
