ROAD TRAFFIC

The A3 Trunk Road (Hog's Back Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A3 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act $1984(\mathbf{a})$, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A3 Trunk Road (Hog's Back Interchange) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 12th February 2011.

2. In this Order:

"the trunk road" means the A3 Trunk Road near Guildford in the County of Surrey;

"central reservation" means that part of the trunk road which separates its carriageways for the safety and guidance of vehicular traffic using that road.

"the slip road" means the road leading from the eastbound carriageway of the A31 to the northbound carriageway of the trunk road at Hog's Back Interchange;

"works" mean carriageway repairs, drainage and all associated work on the trunk road; and

"a works period" means a period of 8 hours starting at 2200 hours on Saturday 19th February 2011 or on any subsequent Saturday or Sunday until 11th August 2012.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, during a works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle –

- (a) to enter or proceed in the gap in the central reservation of the trunk road opposite its junction with Beechcroft Drive near Hog's Back Interchange; or
- (b) to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;

- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
