ROAD TRAFFIC

The A45 Trunk Road (Near Thurlaston, Warwickshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

Made - - - - 12th September 2011

Coming into force - - 19th September 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A45 Trunk Road ("the A45"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road, near Thurlaston, in the County of Warwickshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed nearby:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A45 Trunk Road (Near Thurlaston, Warwickshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 19th September 2011.

2. In this Order:

"the works period" means the period starting at 21:00 hours on Wednesday 21st September 2011 and ending when the said works

have been completed,

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or leave the eastbound or westbound carriageways of the A45 at its junction with the A4071, known as Blue Boar Junction.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle
 - (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable; or
 - (c) being used in connection with the said works.
