#### Citation and commencement

**1.** This Order may be cited as the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre National Health Service Trust (Dissolution) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 1st November 2011.

#### **Dissolution of NHS trust**

2.—(1) The Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre National Health Service Trust is dissolved.

(2) The Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre National Health Service Trust (Establishment) Order 1990(c) is revoked.
