ROAD TRAFFIC

The M5 Motorway (Junction 29 Southbound Exit Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

Made - - - - 12th October 2011

Coming into force - - 19th October 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway ("the M5") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those connecting roads near Exeter in the County of Devon should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junction 29 Southbound Exit Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 19th October 2011.
 - 2. In this Order –

"the slip road" means the southbound exit slip road at M5 Junction 29;

"the works" mean construction works at the Junction including site clearance, earthworks, deposition of capping and sub-base, drainage, ducts, kerbing, carriageway widening, base and binder courses, gantry erection, surfacing, line marking and studs;

"a first works period" means the period starting at 20.00 hours on Friday 21st October 2011 and ending at 06.00 hours on Monday 31st October 2011;

"a second works period" means a period of 58 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Friday 4th November 2011 or on any subsequent Friday and ending when the said works have been completed;

"a third works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 17th January 2012 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a first works period, a second works period or a third works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;
- (c) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works.
