ROAD TRAFFIC

The A5 Trunk Road (Gailey Wharf, Staffordshire) (Temporary 30 Miles Per Hour Speed Limit) Order 2011

Made - - - - 24th January 2011

Coming into force - - 31st January 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A5 Trunk Road ("the A5"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road at Gailey Wharf in the County of Staffordshire should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A5 Trunk Road (Gailey Wharf, Staffordshire) (Temporary 30 Miles Per Hour Speed Limit) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 31 January 2011.

2. In this Order -

"the trunk road" means the A5 between a point 180 metres west of its

junction with Harrison Lane and a point 50 metres west of

its roundabout junction with the M6 Junction 12;

"the works period" means the period starting at 10:00 hours on Monday 7

February 2011 and ending when the said works have been

completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on the trunk road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to any vehicle
 - (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or
