ROAD TRAFFIC

The M5 Motorway (Junctions 13-14) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011

Made - - - - 28th December 2011

Coming into force - - 7th January 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway ("the M5") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road and some of those connecting roads at Junction 14 in the County of Gloucestershire and in South Gloucestershire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 13 -14) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 7th January 2012.

2. In this Order –

"the first length of the M5" means both carriageways of the M5 from a point at the centre of the Eastington Overbridge (south of junction 13) to a point at the centre of the Echo Lane overbridge (near Dursley);

"the second length of the M5" means both carriageways of the M5 from a point 1000 metres north of the centre of the Damery Lane overbridge (north of Junction 14) to a point at the centre of the Gambrill Lane overbridge (south of Junction 14);

"the slip roads" mean the northbound exit and entry slip roads at M5 Junction 14;

"the works" mean central reserve and verge works, including drainage and barrier works, and upgrading of the hard shoulder;

"the hard shoulder" means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the first length of the M5;

"the Regulations" means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);

"overall width" has the meaning given in regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986(c);

"the works period" means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Monday 9th January 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5, no person shall, during the works period:
 - (a) drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the first length of the M5, the second length of the M5, the slip roads and the hard shoulder;
 - (b) cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 3 metres to enter or proceed in any lane other than the left hand lane of the first length of the M5;
 - (c) cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 2.5 metres to enter or proceed in any lane other than the left hand lane or middle lane of the first length of the M5;
 - (d) cause or permit any vehicle to overtake any other moving vehicle on the first length of the M5 and the second length of the M5.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.
- **5**. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
- **6**. During the works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
