## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

## The M4 Motorway (Junctions 19-18) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M4 Motorway ("the M4"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road between Junctions 19 and 18 in South Gloucestershire should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M4 Motorway (Junctions 19-18) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 8 January 2011.

2. In this Order –

"the M4" means the eastbound carriageway of the M4 between Junctions 19 and 18 from a point at the centre of the A432 Badminton Road Overbridge to a point at the centre of the B4465 Westerleigh Road Overbridge;

"the hard shoulder" means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the M4;

"the Regulations" means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);

"the works" mean the installation of MIDAS traffic counter loops;

"a works period" means a period of 9 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 10 January 2011 or any subsequent night and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the M4 and the hard shoulder.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.

**5**. During the works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
