The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Windermere) Regulations 2011

 Made
 24th March 2011

 Coming into force
 23rd July 2011

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Windermere, Cumbria, by reason of the intended holding of a flying display that is scheduled to take place on 23rd and 24th July 2011.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

- **1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Windermere) Regulations 2011 and come into force on 23rd July 2011.
 - **2.** In regulation 3 all times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time.
- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1200 hours and 1700 hours on 23rd and 24th July 2011, no aircraft is to fly below 5,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3 nautical miles whose centre is at 542128N 0025600W.
- (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a clearance issued by the flying display director for the Windermere Air Show.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in airspace in the vicinity of Windermere, Cumbria for a flying display that is scheduled to take place there on 23rd and 24th July 2011. A large number of aircraft will be involved in high-energy manoeuvres during the Airshow and, as a consequence, the Civil Aviation Authority's Directorate of Airspace Policy (DAP), in agreement with the Department for Transport, considers that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of Windermere for reasons of public safety.

Full details of the Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular and NOTAM.
