ROAD TRAFFIC

The A1(M) Motorway (Junction 47, Allerton Moor) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - 31st May 2012

Coming into force - - 10th June 2012

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A1(M) Motorway and connecting roads, in the District of Harrogate, in the County of North Yorkshire, is satisfied that traffic on that motorway should be restricted and prohibited because bridge painting and general maintenance works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the A1(M) Motorway (Junction 47, Allerton Moor) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 10th June 2012.
 - 2. In this Order; -

"the A1(M)" means the A1(M) Motorway;

"the first length of northbound carriageway" means the A1(M) northbound carriageway from a point 1000 metres south of the centreline of the southern overbridge at Junction 47 (Allerton Moor) northwards for a distance of 2600 metres;

"the second length of northbound carriageway" means the A1(M) northbound carriageway from the nose of the northbound exit slip road to the northbound entry slip road at Junction 47, a distance of 1400 metres;

"the first length of southbound carriageway" means the A1(M) southbound carriageway from a point 1000 metres north of the centreline of the northern overbridge at Junction 47 southwards for a distance of 2600 metres;

"the second length of southbound carriageway" means the A1(M) southbound carriageway from the nose of the southbound exit slip road to the nose of the southbound entry slip road at Junction 47, a distance of 1400 metres;

"the works period" means a period of 11 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 11th June 2012 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the first length of northbound carriageway or the first length of southbound carriageway.

- **4.** Subject as mentioned in article 5 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the second length of northbound carriageway or the second length of southbound carriageway.
- **5.** The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs. Nothing in article 4 shall apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes; or
 - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

and nothing in article 3 shall apply to a vehicle being used for the purpose specified in paragraph (a) of this article.

- **6.** No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011(**a**) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
- **7.** The provisions of regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(**b**) are suspended in relation to the hard shoulders adjacent to the first length of northbound carriageway or the first length of southbound carriageway as described in article 2 at such times and to such extent as may, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs; and in this article "hard shoulder" has the meaning given in regulation 3(1)(e) of those Regulations.
