**The Social Security (Industrial Injuries) (Prescribed Diseases)
Amendment (No.2) Regulations 2012**

The Secretary of State for Work and Pensions makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 108(2), 122(1) and 175(1), (3) and (4) of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992(a).

Amendment of Schedule 1 to the Social Security (Industrial Injuries) (Prescribed Diseases) Regulations 1985

1.—(1) Part 1 of Schedule 1 to the Social Security (Industrial Injuries) (Prescribed Diseases) Regulations 1985(b) (list of prescribed diseases and the occupations for which they are prescribed) is amended as follows.

(2) At the end of the entry relating to prescribed disease D10(c) (primary carcinoma of the lung) add—

“; or

- (d) employment wholly or mainly as a coke oven worker:
 - (i) for a period of, or periods which amount in aggregate to, 15 years or more; or
 - (ii) in top oven work, for a period of, or periods which amount in aggregate to, 5 years or more; or
 - (iii) in a combination of top oven work and other coke oven work for a total aggregate period of 15 years or more where one year working in top oven work is treated as equivalent to 3 years in other coke oven work.”.
