ROAD TRAFFIC

The M180 Motorway (Junction 3 to Junction 5) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - 21st June 2012

Coming into force - 1st July 2012

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M180 Motorway and connecting roads, in the County of North Lincolnshire, is satisfied that traffic on that motorway and some of those connecting roads should be prohibited because carriageway repair works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the M180 Motorway (Junction 3 to Junction 5) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 1st July 2012.
- **2.** Subject as mentioned in article 3 of this Order, no person shall, during a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 2nd July 2012 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the M180 Motorway:
 - (i) eastbound carriageway from the nose of the eastbound exit slip road at Junction 3 (Midmoor) to the nose of the eastbound entry slip road at Junction 5 (Barnetby), a distance of approximately 22000 metres:
 - (ii) westbound carriageway from the nose of the westbound exit slip road at Junction 5 to the nose of the westbound entry slip road at Junction 3, a distance of approximately 22000 metres;
 - (iii) eastbound entry or westbound exit slip roads at Junction 3;
 - (iv) eastbound or westbound entry or exit slip roads at Junction 4 (Broughton); or
 - (v) eastbound exit or westbound entry slip roads at Junction 5.
- **3.** The provisions of article 2 of this order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer purposes; or
 - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
