## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

## The M60 Motorway (Junction 19 Clockwise and Anticlockwise Exit Slip Roads) (The Stone Roses Concert) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M60 Motorway and slip roads, is satisfied that traffic on two of those slip roads in the Districts of Bury, Rochdale and Manchester in Greater Manchester should be prohibited for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16A (2)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M60 Motorway (Junction 19 Clockwise and Anticlockwise Exit Slip Roads) (The Stone Roses Concert) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 28th June 2012.

**2.** In this Order;

"the motorway" means the M60 Motorway;

"the first slip road" means the exit slip road leading from the clockwise carriageway of the motorway at Junction 19;

"the second slip road" means the exit slip road leading from the anticlockwise carriageway of the motorway at Junction 19;

"event" means the Stone Roses Concert at Heaton Park, Manchester;

"the event period" means three nights between at 2200 hours and 0100 hours starting on Friday 29 June 2012 and ending on Monday 2 July 2012, continuing as necessary to facilitate the holding of the event.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order, during the event period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first and second slip roads.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue or ambulance services, or by traffic officers, or to any vehicle proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.
