ROAD TRAFFIC

The M42, M6 and M6 Toll Motorways (M42 Junctions 8 to 9) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made---9th July 2012Coming into force--16th July 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M42 Motorway ("the M42"), the M6 Motorway ("the M6"), the M6 Toll Motorway ("the M6 Toll") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of the M42 and M6 Toll and one of those connecting roads, in the County of Warwickshire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1) (a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act $1984(\mathbf{a})$, and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M42, M6 and M6 Toll Motorways (M42 Junctions 8 to 9) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 16th July 2012.

2. In this Order:

"the first length of motorway"	means the northbound carriageway of the M42 and M6 Toll from a point 500 metres south of its of its junction with the link road to a point 200 metres north of the centreline of Marsh Lane overbridge (south of Junction 9);
"the second length of motorway"	means the northbound carriageway of the M42 and M6 Toll from a point 1000 metres north of its of its junction with the link road to a point 200 metres north of the centreline of Marsh Lane overbridge (south of Junction 9);
"the link road"	means the link road leading to the northbound carriageway of the M42 from the southbound carriageway of the M6 at Junction 4a;

"the Regulations"	means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(a);
"a hard shoulder"	means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of Regulation $3(1)(e)$ of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the second length of motorway;
"the works period"	means the period starting at 21:30 hours on Thursday 19th July 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the first length of motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the second length of motorway or the link road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of:

(a) articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle -

- (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or
- (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;
- (b) article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for special forces purposes; and
- (c) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
