## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

## The A38 Trunk Road (Barton-under-Needwood, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No.3) Order 2012

Made---30th July 2012Coming into force--6th August 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A38 Trunk Road ("the A38"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road, north of Barton under Needwood in the County of Staffordshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (**a**), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A38 Trunk Road (Barton-under-Needwood, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No.3) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 6th August 2012.

2. In this Order –

"Barton Service Road"	means the service road adjacent to the northbound carriageway of the A38, Lichfield Road, north of Barton under Needwood;
"the works period"	means the period starting at 08:00 hours on Monday 13th August 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any pedestrian to enter or proceed in the footway adjacent to Barton Service Road.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

- 5. The provisions of 3 shall not apply to
  - (i) any pedestrian engaged in police, fire brigade or ambulance activities;
  - (ii) any pedestrian acting under the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer in uniform;
  - (iii) personnel engaged in the said works; or
  - (iv) any person proceeding in the footway to or from premises which are accessible for that person from, and only from, that footway.
