ROAD TRAFFIC

The A14 Trunk Road (Kettering, Northamptonshire) (Temporary 50 Miles Per Hour Speed Restriction) Order 2012

Made---28th August 2012Coming into force--4th September 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A14 Trunk Road ("the A14"), is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road near Kettering in the County of Northamptonshire should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A14 Trunk Road (Kettering, Northamptonshire) (Temporary 50 Miles Per Hour Speed Restriction) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 4th September 2012.

2. In this Order –

"the trunk road"

means -

- i) the eastbound carriageway of the A14 from the centrepoint of the A508 overbridge at Scotland Wood to the centrepoint of the roundabout junction with the A43 and A4300 at Kettering; and
- the westbound carriageway of the A14 from the centrepoint of the roundabout junction with the A43 and A4300 at Kettering to the centrepoint of the A508 overbridge at Scotland Wood;

"the works period"

means the period starting at 21:00 hours on Monday 10th September 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the trunk road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to any vehicle –

- (a) being used for special forces, police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable.
