ROAD TRAFFIC

The A38 Trunk Road (Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - 1st October 2012

Coming into force - -8th October 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A38 Trunk Road ("the A38"), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road, near Burton upon Trent in the County of Staffordshire, should be prohibited because of the likelihood of danger to the public:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A38 Trunk Road (Burton upon Trent, Staffordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 8th October 2012.

2. In this Order:

"the central reservation"

means that part of the trunk road which separates its carriageways for the safety and guidance of vehicular traffic using that road;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the period starting at 23:00 on Thursday 11th October 2012 and ending when the said likelihood of danger has been avoided by means other than this order, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed through the gap in the central reservation of the A38 adjacent to the access road leading to Branston Industrial Estate, approximately 390 metres south of the northbound exit slip to the A5121 Branston Junction.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
