## ROAD TRAFFIC

The M6 Motorway (Junctions 1 to 2) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No.3) Order 2012

> Made 22nd October 2012

> Coming into force - -29th October 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway ("the M6") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and two of those connecting roads in the County of Warwickshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M6 Motorway (Junctions 1 to 2) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (No.3) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 29th October 2012.

## **2.** In this Order:

means the northbound carriageway of the M6 from its "the motorway"

junction with the exit slip road at Junction 1 to its junction

with the entry slip road at Junction 2;

"a slip road" means -

> i) the slip road leading to the northbound carriageway of the M6 at Junction 1;

the slip road leading from the northbound

ii)

carriageway of the M6 Junction 2;

"the works period" means the period starting at 23:00 hours on Monday 5th

November 2012 and ending when the said works have

been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway or a slip road.

- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle
  - (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
  - (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform, or
  - (iii) being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
