## ROAD TRAFFIC

## The A2 Trunk Road (Dunkirk, Eastbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

*Made - - - - 10th December 2012* 

Coming into force - - 2nd January 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A2 Trunk Road and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road and on one of those connecting roads because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the A2 Trunk Road (Dunkirk, Eastbound) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 2nd January 2013.
  - 2. In this Order:

"the trunk road" means the A2 Trunk Road at Dunkirk in the County of Kent;

"the slip road" means the road leading to the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road from London Road at Dunkirk;

"lay-by" means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(**b**);

"the lay-by" means the lay-by in the eastbound carriageway of the trunk road 800 metres east of the centre of Canterbury Road overbridge at Dunkirk;

"works" mean cycleway renewal work on the trunk road; and

- "a works period" means a period of 9½ hours starting at 1930 hours on Wednesday 2nd January 2013 or on any subsequent day until 1st July 2014.
- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period cause or permit any vehicle to
  - (i) enter or proceed in, or wait on, an A2 lay-by, or
  - (ii) enter or proceed in the slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -
  - (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
