## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

The A14 Trunk Road (Junction 23 Spittals Interchange to Junction 24 Godmanchester Interchange, Cambridgeshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made -	-	-	-	26th November 2012
Coming into	force	-	-	3rd December 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A14 Trunk Road ("the A14") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road and on some of those connecting roads in the County of Cambridgeshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act  $1984(\mathbf{a})$ , hereby makes the following Order: -

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A14 Trunk Road (Junction 23 Spittals Interchange to Junction 24 Godmanchester Interchange, Cambridgeshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 3rd December 2012.

2. In this Order –

"tip of the nosing" means, as indicated by the markings on the carriageway, the first point where an entry slip road joins, or the last point where an exit slip road leaves, the carriageway of the trunk road;

"Junction 23" and "Junction 24" mean, respectively, the A14/A141 Spittals Interchange and the A14/A1198/B1044 Godmanchester Interchange;

"the trunk road" means the -

- (a) eastbound carriageway of the A14 between the tips of nosings of the exit slip road at Junction 23 and the entry slip road at Junction 24, and
- (b) westbound carriageway of the A14 between the tips of the nosings of the exit slip road at Junction 24 and the entry slip road at Junction 23;

"a slip road" means the A14 –

- (a) eastbound entry slip road at Junction 23, and
- (b) westbound entry slip road at Junction 24;

"works" mean the removal of narrow lanes and vario-guard safety barriers at Ouse Viaduct;

"the works period" means the period starting at 21.00 hours on Thursday 6th December 2012 and ending when the works have been completed;

"a works period" means a period of 9 hours starting at 21:00 hours on Friday 7th December 2012 or on any subsequent day until the works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in -

(a) the trunk road or a slip road, during a works period, or

(b) any lay-by adjacent to the trunk road, during the works period.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to a vehicle –

- (a) being used in connection with the works or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes,
- (b) being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes, or
- (c) proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or traffic officer in uniform.
