## ROAD TRAFFIC

## The M5 Motorway (Junctions 8 to 6) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

*Made - - - - 3rd February 2012* 

Coming into force - - 10th February 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway ("the M5") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and one of those connecting roads, in the Counties of Worcestershire and Gloucestershire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 8 to 6) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 10th February 2012.

## **2.** In this Order:

"the motorway" means the northbound carriageway of the M5 from its

junction with the exit slip road at Junction 8 to its junction

with the entry slip road at Junction 6;

"a slip road" means the slip road leading to –

(a) the northbound carriageway of the M5 at Junction 8;

and

(b) the northbound carriageway of the M5 at Junction 7;

"the works period" means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Saturday 11th

February 2012 and ending when the said works have been

completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway or a slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle
  - (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
  - (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform, or
  - (iii) being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
