ROAD TRAFFIC

The M69 Motorway (Junction 1 – A46) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M69 Motorway ("the M69") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and one of those connecting roads in the Counties of Leicestershire and Warwickshire, should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M69 Motorway (Junction 1 – A46) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 10th February 2012.

2. In this Order –

"the motorway"	means the southbound carriageway of the M69 from its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 1 to the merge point with the A46 north of Coventry;
"the slip road"	means the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway of the M69 at Junction 1;
"the Regulations"	means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);
"a hard shoulder"	means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of Regulation $3(1)(e)$ of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the motorway;
"the works period"	means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Saturday 11th February 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the motorway or the slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of:

- (a) articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle
 - (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or
 - (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;
- (b) article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for special forces purposes; and

(c) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
