FOOD, ENGLAND

The Authorised Officers (Meat Inspection) (Revocation) (England) Regulations 2012

Made	4th March 2012
Laid before Parliament	8th March 2012
Coming into force	6th April 2012

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5(6) of the Food Safety Act $1990(\mathbf{a})$ and now vested in him(**b**).

As required by Article 9 of Regulation (EC) No. 178/2002 of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down the general principles and requirements of food law, establishing the European Food Safety Authority and laying down procedures in matters of food safety(\mathbf{c}) there has been open and transparent public consultation during the preparation and evaluation of these Regulations.

Title application and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Authorised Officers (Meat Inspection) (Revocation) (England) Regulations 2012, apply in relation to England only and come into force on 6th April 2012.

Revocation

2. The Authorised Officers (Meat Inspection) Regulations 1987(d) are revoked.

Those functions so far as exercisable in relation to Scotland were transferred to the Scotlish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (1998 c.46) as read with section 40(2) of the 1999 Act.
