The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Diamond Jubilee Concert) Regulations 2012

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of central London, by reason of the holding of a concert at Buckingham Palace to celebrate Her Majesty the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, that is scheduled to take place on 4th June 2012.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 161 of the Air Navigation Order $2009(\mathbf{a})$.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Diamond Jubilee Concert) Regulations 2012 and come into force on 4th June 2012.

2. In regulations 3 and 4 all times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time.

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1430 hours and 2259 hours on 4th June, no aircraft is to fly below 2,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3.5 nautical miles whose centre is 513006N 0000832W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft—

- (a) making an approach to, or departing from-
 - (i) London City Airport,
 - (ii) London Heathrow Airport, or
 - (iii) RAF Northolt,

whilst under the control of, as the case may be, the London Terminal Control Centre at Swanwick or RAF Northolt Approach;

- (b) operated by-
 - (i) the Metropolitan Police Service, or
 - (ii) the Helicopter Emergency Medical Services; or
- (c) flying with the specific authority of Acting Superintendent Steve Osborn or Chief Superintendent Julia Pendry of the Metropolitan Police Service.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations restrict flying in the vicinity of central London on the occasion of The Diamond Jubilee Concert, which is scheduled to take place at Buckingham Palace on 4th June 2012.

The Home Office, on behalf of the Metropolitan Police, considers that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of central London for reasons of security and this has been agreed with the Civil Aviation Authority's Directorate of Airspace Policy (DAP) and the Department for Transport.
