**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The M5 Motorway (Junctions 24 and 25 Slip Roads)  
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

*Coming into force*   -   -                                *1st September 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway (“the M5”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on some of those connecting roads at Junctions 24 and 25 in the County of Somerset should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 24 and 25 Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 1st September 2013 and apply for a period of seven months.

**2.** In this Order –

“the slip roads” mean (i) the northbound and southbound exit slip roads at M5 Junction 24; and (ii) the northbound and southbound exit slip roads at M5 Junction 25;

“the works” mean litter picking, gully cleaning, sweeping, grass cutting, studs, barrier re-tensioning, road markings, patching and general maintenance;

“a works period” means a period of 8½ hours starting at 21.00 hours on Tuesday 3rd September 2013 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip roads.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction or with the permission of a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

- (c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works or for winter maintenance purposes.
