ROAD TRAFFIC

The M5 Motorway (Junctions 12-11A) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) (Number 2) Order 2013

 Made
 28th August 2013

 Coming into force
 31st August 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway ("the M5"), is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road between Junctions 12 and 11A in the County of Gloucestershire should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and regulation 16(2) of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b), hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 12-11A) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) (Number 2) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 31st August 2013.

2. In this Order –

"the M5" means the northbound carriageway of the M5 north of Junction 12 from a point at the centre of Gilberts Lane cattle creep to a point at the centre of Wheatridge bridge;

"the hard shoulder" means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the M5;

"the Regulations" means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(c);

"overall width" has the meaning given in regulation 3(2) of the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986(**d**);

"the works" mean drainage renewal works and associated barrier reinstatement;

"the works period" means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Monday 2nd September 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to an article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 6 no person shall, during the works period drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the M5.

- **4.** Subject as mentioned in articles 6 and 7, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 3 metres to enter or proceed in any lane other than the left hand lane of the M5.
- **5**. Subject as mentioned in articles 6 and 7, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle with an overall width exceeding 2.5 metres to enter or proceed in any lane other than the left hand lane or middle lane of the M5.
 - **6**. The provisions of articles 3, 4 and 5 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes; or
 - (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.
- **7.** The provisions of articles 4 and 5 shall not apply to a vehicle being used in connection with the said works, for traffic officer purposes.
- **8**. During the works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
- **9**. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
