## ROAD TRAFFIC

# The M6 Toll Motorway (Junctions T4 to T3) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

 Made
 19th August 2013

 Coming into force
 26th August 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Toll Motorway ("the M6 Toll") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and one of those connecting roads, in the Counties of Staffordshire and Warwickshire and the City of Birmingham should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M6 Toll Motorway (Junctions T4 to T3) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 26th August 2013.

### 2. In this Order -

"the motorway" means the southbound carriageway M6 Toll from its junction

with the exit slip road at Junction T4 to its junction with the

entry slip road at Junction T3;

"the slip road" means the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway

of the M6 Toll at Junction T4;

"the works period" means the period starting at 21.00 hours on Monday 2nd

September 2013 and ending when the said works have been

completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

- **3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the motorway or the slip road.
- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle -

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (c) being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
