ROAD TRAFFIC

The M1 Motorway (Junction 19 to Junction 20) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway ("the M1") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorways and two of those connecting roads, in the County of Leicestershire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(**a**), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (Junction 19 to Junction 20) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 27th September 2013.

2. In this Order –

"the motorway"	means – the northbound carriageway of the M1 from its junction with the link road leading to the M6 at Junction 19 to its junction with the entry slip road at Junction 20;
"a slip road"	 means – (a) the slip road leading to the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 19; and (b) the slip road leading from the northbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 20;
"the works period"	means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Monday 30th September 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway or a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

5. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle -

(a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;

(b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or

(c) being used in connection with the works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
