## **ROAD TRAFFIC**

## The M5 Motorway (Junctions 19-20) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway ("the M5") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and one of those connecting roads in North Somerset should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and regulation 16(2) of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b), hereby makes the following Order:

**1.** This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junctions 19-20) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 4th January 2014.

2. In this Order –

"the M5" means the southbound carriageway of the M5 from a point 200 metres north of the centre of the Naish Hill Overbridge (south of Junction 19) to a point at the centre of the Davis Lane Overbridge (south of Junction 20);

"the slip road" means the southbound exit slip road at M5 Junction 20;

"the Regulations" means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982;

"the hard shoulder" means the hard shoulder within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations which is adjacent to the M5;

"the works" mean resurfacing, white lining, stud replacement, bridge joint and loop cutting works;

"a works period" means a period of 9 hours starting at 21.00 hours on Monday 6th January 2014 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to an article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in articles 4, 5 and 7, no person shall, during a works period:

- (a) drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the M5;
- (b) cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.

**4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

(a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes; or

(b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.

**5**. The provisions of article 3(b) shall not apply to a vehicle being used in connection with the works, for traffic officer purposes or for winter maintenance purposes.

**6.** During a works period, regulation 5 and (insofar as it relates to a vehicle being driven) regulation 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended, in respect of the hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

**7**. No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
