**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A12 Trunk Road (Copdock Mill Interchange, Ipswich,  
Suffolk) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

*Made* - - - *11th February 2013*

*Coming into force* - - *18th February 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A12 Trunk Road (“the A12”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road in the County of Suffolk should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A12 Trunk Road (Copdock Mill Interchange, Ipswich, Suffolk) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 18th February 2013.

2. In this Order –

“the roundabout” means the circulatory carriageway of the A12 roundabout at the A12/A14 Copdock Mill Interchange (Junction 33 of the A12 and Junction 55 of the A14 Trunk Road);

“the trunk road” means the south bridge section of the roundabout between the junctions of the eastbound entry slip road to, and westbound exit slip road from, the A14 Trunk Road;

“works” mean parapet replacement to the south bridge at Copdock Mill Interchange;

“a works period” means a period of 9 hours starting at 21:00 hours on Monday 25th February 2013 or on any subsequent day (other than a Saturday or a Sunday) until the works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the trunk road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to a vehicle –

(a) being used for, or in connection with, the works, or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes,

(b) being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes, or

(c) proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or traffic officer in uniform.
