ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A36 Trunk Road (Monkton Combe to Limpley Stoke)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014**

Made - - - - *8th September 2014*

Coming into force - - *10th September 2014*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A36 Trunk Road (“the A36”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road in Bath and North East Somerset should be prohibited for the purpose of facilitating the holding of a relevant event:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 16A(2)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Monkton Combe to Limpley Stoke) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 10th September 2014.

2. In this Order –

“the A36” means the A36 Warminster Road between its junction with Trollope’s Hill, Monkton Combe, and its junction with Midford Lane;

“event” means the Tour of Britain cycling event;

“an event period” means a period of 6 hours starting at 09.00 hours on Friday 12th September 2014;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during an event period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A36.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
