ROAD TRAFFIC

The A1(M) Motorway (Junction 43 to Junction 42) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014

Made - - - - 29th December 2014

Coming into force - - 13th January 2015

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A1(M) Motorway and connecting roads, in the District of Leeds, in the County of West Yorkshire, is satisfied that traffic on that motorway should be prohibited because message sign and signal renewal works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order:

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the A1(M) Motorway (Junction 43 to Junction 42) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2014 and shall come into force on 13th January 2015.
- **2.** Subject as mentioned in article 3 of this Order, no person shall, during a period of 10 hours starting at 20:00 hours on Wednesday 14th January 2015 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A1(M) Motorway southbound carriageway from its diverge with the M1 Motorway southbound carriageway at Hook Moor (A1(M) Motorway Junction 43 and M1 Motorway Junction 48) to the nose of the southbound entry slip road at Junction 42 (Selby Fork), a distance of 8047 metres
- **3.** The provisions of article 2 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer or winter maintenance purposes; or
 - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
