**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A30 Trunk Road (Bodmin) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2015**

*Made* - - - - 24th February 2015

*Coming into force* - - 27th February 2015

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A30 Trunk Road (“the A30”), is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that road near Bodmin in Cornwall should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A30 Trunk Road (Bodmin) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2015 and shall come into force on 27th February 2015.

2. In this Order –

“the first length of the A30” means both carriageways of the A30 near Bodmin from a point 2000 metres west of the centre of Carminow Cross Overbridge to a point 2000 metres east of the centre of the Callywith Junction Overbridge;

“the second length of the A30” means both carriageways of the A30 near Bodmin from a point 500 metres west of the centre of Carminow Cross Overbridge to a point 500 metres east of the centre of Callywith Junction Overbridge;

“the third length of the A30” means (i) the eastbound carriageway of the A30 from the tip of the nosing of the eastbound exit slip road at the Carminow Junction to the tip of the nosing of the eastbound entry slip road at the Callywith Junction; and (ii) the westbound carriageway of the A30 from the tip of the nosing of the westbound exit slip road at the Callywith Junction to the tip of the nosing of the westbound entry slip road at the Carminow Junction;

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“tip of the nosing” means the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a trunk road or the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a trunk road;

“bicycle” means a pedal cycle with fewer than four wheels and not being a mechanically propelled vehicle;

“the works” mean the replacement of a bridge parapet and safety barrier;

“the works period” means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Sunday 1st March 2015 and ending when the said works have been completed;

“a works period” means a period of 11 hours starting at 19.00 hours on Sunday 1st March 2015 or on any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in articles 8 and 10, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the first length of the A30.

**4.** Subject as mentioned in articles 8 and 10, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 10 miles per hour on the second length of the A30 whilst traffic signs of a character authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating “convoy working” on that road are displayed.

**5.** Subject as mentioned in articles 8 and 9, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or remain in the laybys adjacent to the third length of the A30.

**6.** Subject as mentioned in articles 8 and 9, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the third length of the A30.

**7.** Subject as mentioned in article 8, no person using a bicycle shall enter or proceed in the third length of the A30 during the works period.

**8.** The provisions of articles 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable.

**9.** The provisions of articles 5 and 6 shall not apply to a vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works, for traffic officer purposes or for winter maintenance purposes.

**10.** No speed limit imposed by this order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
