The Double Taxation Relief and International Tax Enforcement (Bulgaria) Order 2015

Made - - - - 11th November 2015

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of November 2015 Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

A draft of this Order was laid before the House of Commons in accordance with section 5(2) of the Taxation (International and Other Provisions) Act 2010(1) and section 173(7) of the Finance Act 2006(2) and approved by a resolution of that House.

Accordingly, Her Majesty, in exercising the powers conferred upon Her by section 2 of the Taxation (International and Other Provisions) Act 2010 and section 173(1) to (3) of the Finance Act 2006, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, orders as follows—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Double Taxation Relief and International Tax Enforcement (Bulgaria) Order 2015.

Double taxation and international tax enforcement arrangements to have effect

2. It is declared that—

- (a) the arrangements specified in the Convention set out in the Schedule to this Order have been made with the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria;
- (b) the arrangements have been made with a view to affording relief from double taxation in relation to capital gains tax, corporation tax and income tax and taxes of a similar

character imposed by the laws of the Republic of Bulgaria and for the purposes of assisting international tax enforcement; and

(c) it is expedient that those arrangements should have effect.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

CONVENTION BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF BULGARIA AND TH UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAN FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF DOUBLE TAXATION AND THE PREVENT OF FISCAL EVASION WITH RESPECT TO TAXES ON INCOME AND CAPITAL GAINS

The Republic of Bulgaria and The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland

Desiring to conclude a Convention for the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income and on capital gains

Have agreed as follows:

CHAPTER I

SCOPE OF THE CONVENTION

Article 1

Persons Covered

This Convention shall apply to persons who are residents of one or both of the Contracting St

Article 2

Taxes Covered

1. This Convention shall apply to taxes on income and on capital gains imposed on behave a Contracting State or of its political subdivisions or local authorities, irrespective of the many which they are levied.

 There shall be regarded as taxes on income and on capital gains all taxes imposed on income, or on elements of income, including taxes on gains from the alienation of movable or immovable property.

3. The existing taxes to which the Convention shall apply are:

- (a) in Bulgaria:
- (i) the personal income tax;
- (ii) the corporate income tax;

(hereinafter referred to as "Bulgarian tax");

- (b) in the United Kingdom:
- i) the income tax;
- ii) the corporation tax; and
- iii) the capital gains tax;

(hereinafter referred to as "United Kingdom tax").

4. The Convention shall apply also to any identical or substantially similar taxes that are imposed after the date of signature of the Convention in addition to, or in place of, the existing taxes. The competent authorities of the Contracting States shall notify each other of any significant changes that have been made in their taxation laws.

CHAPTER II

DEFINITIONS

Article 3

General Definitions

- 1. For the purposes of this Convention, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) the term "Bulgaria" means the Republic of Bulgaria and when used in a geographical sense means the territory and the territorial sea over which it exercises its State sovereignty, as well as the continental shelf and the exclusive economic zone over which it exercises sovereign rights and jurisdiction in conformity with international law;
 - (b) the term "United Kingdom" means Great Britain and Northern Ireland but, when used geographical sense, means the territory and territorial sea of Great Britain and Norther Ireland and the areas beyond that territorial sea over which Great Britain and Norther Ireland exercise sovereign rights or jurisdiction in accordance with their domestic law international law;
 - (c) the terms "a Contracting State" and "the other Contracting State" mean Bulgaria or th United Kingdom as the context requires;
 - (d) the term "person" includes an individual, a company and any other body of persons;
 - (e) the term "company" means any body corporate or any entity that is treated as a body corporate for tax purposes;
 - (f) the term "enterprise" applies to the carrying on of any business;
 - (g) the terms "enterprise of a Contracting State" and "enterprise of the other Contracting State" mean respectively an enterprise carried on by a resident of a Contracting State an enterprise carried on by a resident of the other Contracting State;

- (h) the term "international traffic" means any transport by a ship, aircraft or road transpo vehicle, except when the ship, aircraft or vehicle is operated solely between places in Contracting State by an enterprise that is not a resident of that State.
- (i) the term "competent authority" means:
 - (i) in Bulgaria, the Minister of Finance or an authorised representative;
 - (ii) in the United Kingdom, the Commissioners for Her Majesty's Revenue Customs or their authorised representative;
- (j) the term "national" means:
 - in relation to Bulgaria, any individual possessing the nationality of Bulg and any legal person, partnership or association deriving its status as suc from the laws in force in Bulgaria;
 - (ii) in relation to the United Kingdom, any British citizen, or any British sub not possessing the citizenship of any other Commonwealth country or territory, provided he has the right of abode in the United Kingdom; and legal person, partnership or association deriving its status as such from t laws in force in the United Kingdom;
- (k) the term "business" includes the performance of professional services and of other activities of an independent character;
- (1) the term "pension scheme" means any plan, scheme, fund, foundation, trust or other arrangement established in a Contracting State which:
 - (i) is generally exempt from income taxation under the laws of that State; a
 - (ii) operates to administer or provide pension or retirement benefits or to ear income for the benefit of one or more such arrangements.

2. As regards the application of the provisions of the Convention at any time by a Contracting State, any term not defined therein shall, unless the context otherwise requires, has the meaning that it has at that time under the laws of that State for the purposes of the taxes to which the Convention applies, any meaning under the applicable tax laws of that State prevail over a meaning given to the term under other laws of that State.

Article 4

Resident

1. For the purposes of this Convention, the term "resident of a Contracting State" means person who, under the laws of that State, is liable to tax therein by reason of his domicile, residence, place of incorporation, place of management or any other criterion of a similar natural and also includes that State and any political subdivision or local authority thereof. This term however, does not include any person who is liable to tax in that State in respect only of incorporation.

3. Where by reason of the provisions of paragraph 1 an individual is a resident of both Contracting States, then his status shall be determined as follows:

- (a) he shall be deemed to be a resident only of the State in which he has a permanent hor available to him; if he has a permanent home available to him in both States, he shall deemed to be a resident only of the State with which his personal and economic relat are closer (centre of vital interests);
- (b) if the State in which he has his centre of vital interests cannot be determined, or if he not have a permanent home available to him in either State, he shall be deemed to be resident only of the State in which he has an habitual abode;
- (c) if he has an habitual abode in both States or in neither of them, he shall be deemed to resident only of the State of which he is a national;
- (d) if he is a national of both States or of neither of them, the competent authorities of the Contracting States shall settle the question by mutual agreement.

4. Where by reason of the provisions of paragraph 1 a person other than an individual is resident of both Contracting States, then the competent authorities of the Contracting States si endeavour to determine by mutual agreement the Contracting State of which that person shall deemed to be a resident for the purposes of this Convention. In the absence of a mutual agree by the competent authorities of the Contracting States, the person shall not be considered a resident of either Contracting State for the purposes of claiming any benefits provided by the Convention, except those provided by Articles 21, 23 and 24.

Article 5

Permanent Establishment

1. For the purposes of this Convention, the term "permanent establishment" means a fix place of business through which the business of an enterprise is wholly or partly carried on.

- The term "permanent establishment" includes especially:
 - (a) a place of management;
 - (b) a branch;
 - (c) an office;
 - (d) a factory;
 - (e) a workshop; and
 - (f) a mine, an oil or gas well, a quarry or any other place of exploration or extraction of natural resources.
- A building site or construction or installation project constitutes a permanent

- (b) the maintenance of a stock of goods or merchandise belonging to the enterprise solely the purpose of storage, display or delivery;
- (c) the maintenance of a stock of goods or merchandise belonging to the enterprise solely the purpose of processing by another enterprise;
- (d) the maintenance of a fixed place of business solely for the purpose of purchasing goo merchandise, or of collecting information, for the enterprise;
- (e) the maintenance of a fixed place of business solely for the purpose of carrying on, for enterprise, any other activity of a preparatory or auxiliary character;
- (f) the maintenance of a fixed place of business solely for any combination of activities mentioned in subparagraphs (a) to (e), provided that the overall activity of the fixed p of business resulting from this combination is of a preparatory or auxiliary character.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2, where a person - other than an agent of an independent status to whom paragraph 6 applies - is acting on behalf of an enterprise and has, and habitually exercises, in a Contracting State an authority to conclude contracts on behalf of the enterprise, that enterprise shall be deemed to have a permanent establishment in State in respect of any activities which that person undertakes for the enterprise, unless the activities of such person are limited to those mentioned in paragraph 4 which, if exercised threa fixed place of business, would not make this fixed place of business a permanent establishment under the provisions of that paragraph.

6. An enterprise shall not be deemed to have a permanent establishment in a Contracting State merely because it carries on business in that State through a broker, general commission agent or any other agent of an independent status, provided that such persons are acting in the ordinary course of their business.

7. The fact that a company which is a resident of a Contracting State controls or is controls or a company which is a resident of the other Contracting State, or which carries on business that other State (whether through a permanent establishment or otherwise), shall not of itself constitute either company a permanent establishment of the other.

CHAPTER III

TAXATION OF INCOME AND CAPITAL GAINS

Article 6

Income from Immovable Property

1. Income derived by a resident of a Contracting State from immovable property (include income from agriculture or forestry) situated in the other Contracting State may be taxed in the other State.

2. The term "immovable property" shall have the meaning which it has under the law of Contracting State in which the property in question is situated. The term shall in any case include the property is a structure of the term shall in any case include the term shall be a structure of term sh

4. The provisions of paragraphs 1 and 3 shall also apply to the income from immovable property of an enterprise.

Article 7

Business Profits

1. The profits of an enterprise of a Contracting State shall be taxable only in that State of the enterprise carries on business in the other Contracting State through a permanent establish situated therein. If the enterprise carries on business as aforesaid, the profits of the enterprise be taxed in the other State but only so much of them as is attributable to that permanent establishment.

2. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 3, where an enterprise of a Contracting State carries on business in the other Contracting State through a permanent establishment situated therein, there shall in each Contracting State be attributed to that permanent establishment the profits which it might be expected to make if it were a distinct and separate enterprise engage the same or similar activities under the same or similar conditions and dealing wholly independently with the enterprise of which it is a permanent establishment.

3. In determining the profits of a permanent establishment, there shall be allowed as deductions expenses which are incurred for the purposes of the permanent establishment, including executive and general administrative expenses so incurred, whether in the State in v the permanent establishment is situated or elsewhere.

4. No profits shall be attributed to a permanent establishment by reason of the mere pur by that permanent establishment of goods or merchandise for the enterprise.

5. For the purposes of the preceding paragraphs, the profits to be attributed to the perma establishment shall be determined by the same method year by year unless there is good and sufficient reason to the contrary.

6. Where profits include items of income or capital gains which are dealt with separatel other Articles of this Convention, then the provisions of those Articles shall not be affected by provisions of this Article.

Article 8

International Transport

1. Profits of an enterprise of a Contracting State from the operation of ships, aircraft or transport vehicles in international traffic shall be taxable only in that State.

The provisions of paragraph 1 shall also apply to profits from the participation in a p joint business or an international operating agency.

Article 9

Associated Enterprises

and in either case conditions are made or imposed between the two enterprises in their comm or financial relations which differ from those which would be made between indepe enterprises, then any profits which would, but for those conditions, have accrued to one of enterprises, but, by reason of those conditions, have not so accrued, may be included in the p of that enterprise and taxed accordingly.

2. Where a Contracting State includes in the profits of an enterprise of that State – and t accordingly – profits on which an enterprise of the other Contracting State has been charged t in that other State and the profits so included are profits which would have accrued to the enterprise of the first-mentioned State if the conditions made between the two enterprises had those which would have been made between independent enterprises, then that other State sha make an appropriate adjustment to the amount of the tax charged therein on those profits. In determining such adjustment, due regard shall be had to the other provisions of this Convention and the competent authorities of the Contracting States shall if necessary consult each other.

Article 10

Dividends

1. Dividends paid by a company which is a resident of a Contracting State to a resident the other Contracting State may be taxed in that other State.

- 2. However, dividends paid by a company which is a resident of a Contracting State:
 - (a) may also be taxed in that State and according to the laws of that State, but if the bene owner of the dividends is a resident of the other Contracting State, the tax so charged not exceed:
 - (i) 5 per cent of the gross amount of the dividends, except as provided in subparagraph a) (ii);
 - (ii) 15 per cent of the gross amount of the dividends where those dividends paid out of income (including gains) derived directly or indirectly from immovable property within the meaning of Article 6 by an investment vehicle which distributes most of this income annually and whose incon from such immovable property is exempted from tax;
 - (b) shall, notwithstanding the provisions of subparagraph (a), be exempt from tax in that if the beneficial owner of the dividends is:
 - a company which is a resident of the other Contracting State (other than where the dividends are paid by an investment vehicle as mentioned in subparagraph (a) (ii)); or
 - (ii) a pension scheme.

This paragraph shall not affect the taxation of the company in respect of the profits out of w the dividends are paid. 3. The provisions of paragraph 2 shall not apply in the case of a dividend which is a hid profit distribution under the laws in force in Bulgaria.

4. The term "dividends" as used in this Article means income from shares or other right not being debt claims, participating in profits, as well as any other item which is treated as inc from shares by the taxation laws of the State of which the company making the distribution is resident.

5. The provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 shall not apply if the beneficial owner of the dividends, being a resident of a Contracting State, carries on business in the other Contracting State of which the company paying the dividends is a resident, through a permanent establish situated therein, and the holding in respect of which the dividends are paid is effectively conn with such permanent establishment. In such case, the provisions of Article 7 shall apply.

6. Where a company which is a resident of a Contracting State derives profits or income from the other Contracting State, that other State may not impose any tax on the dividends pa the company, except insofar as such dividends are paid to a resident of that other State or inso as the holding in respect of which the dividends are paid is effectively connected with a perm establishment situated in that other State, nor subject the company's undistributed profits to a on the company's undistributed profits, even if the dividends paid or the undistributed profits consist wholly or partly of profits or income arising in that other State.

7. No relief shall be available under this Article if it was the main purpose or one of the main purposes of any person concerned with the creation or assignment of the shares or other rights in respect of which the dividend is paid to take advantage of this Article by means of the creation or assignment.

Article 11

Interest

1. Interest arising in a Contracting State and paid to a resident of the other Contracting 3 may be taxed in that other State.

2. However, such interest may also be taxed in the Contracting State in which it arises a according to the laws of that State, but if the beneficial owner of the interest is a resident of the other Contracting State, the tax so charged shall not exceed 5 per cent of the gross amount of interest.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 2, interest arising in a Contracting State beneficially owned by a resident of the other Contracting State shall be taxable only in that ot State to the extent that such interest is paid:

- (a) with respect of indebtedness arising as a consequence of the sale on credit of any equipment, merchandise or services;
- (b) on any loan of whatever kind granted by a financial institution;
- (c) to a pension scheme;
- (d) to the Government of that other State, a political subdivision or local authority thereor to the central bank of that other State; or
- (e) between companies, where one company holds directly at least 10 per cent of the cap of the other company for at least one year prior to the payment of the interest or when both companies are held by a third company which holds directly at least 10 per cent the capital of both aforementioned companies for at least one year prior to the payme the interest.

4. The term "interest" as used in this Article means income from debt claims of every k whether or not secured by mortgage and whether or not carrying a right to participate in the debtor's profits, and in particular, income from government securities and income from bonds debentures, including premiums and prizes attaching to such securities, bonds or debentures. Penalty charges for late payment shall not be regarded as interest for the purposes of this Artic The term shall not include any item which is treated as a dividend under the provisions of Art 10.

5. The provisions of paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 shall not apply if the beneficial owner of the interest, being a resident of a Contracting State, carries on business in the other Contracting S in which the interest arises through a permanent establishment situated therein and the debt cl in respect of which the interest is paid is effectively connected with such permanent established. In such case the provisions of Article 7 shall apply.

6. Interest shall be deemed to arise in a Contracting State when the payer is a resident o State. Where, however, the person paying the interest, whether he is a resident of a Contracting State or not, has in a Contracting State a permanent establishment in connection with which the indebtedness on which the interest is paid was incurred, and such interest is borne by such permanent establishment, then such interest shall be deemed to arise in the State in which the permanent establishment is situated.

7. Where, by reason of a special relationship between the payer and the beneficial owner between both of them and some other person, the amount of the interest paid exceeds, for whatever reason, the amount which would have been agreed upon by the payer and the benefic owner in the absence of such relationship, the provisions of this Article shall apply only to the mentioned amount. In such case, the excess part of the payments shall remain taxable accord to the laws of each Contracting State, due regard being had to the other provisions of this Convention.

8. No relief shall be available under this Article if it was the main purpose or one of the main purposes of any person concerned with the creation or assignment of the debt-claim in respect of which the interest is paid to take advantage of this Article by means of that creation assignment.

Article 12

Royalties

1. Royalties arising in a Contracting State and paid to a resident of the other Contracting State may be taxed in that other State.

2. However, such royalties may also be taxed in the Contracting State in which they aris and according to the laws of that State, but if the beneficial owner of the royalties is a residen the other Contracting State, the tax so charged shall not exceed 5 per cent of the gross amount the royalties.

3. The term "royalties" as used in this Article means payments of any kind received as a consideration for the use of, or the right to use, any copyright of literary, artistic or scientific vincluding cinematograph films, any patent, trade mark, design or model, plan, secret formula process, or for information (know-how) concerning industrial, commercial or scientific experience.

4. The provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 shall not apply if the beneficial owner of the royalties, being a resident of a Contracting State, carries on business in the other Contracting in which the royalties arise through a permanent establishment situated therein and the right o property in respect of which the royalties are paid is effectively connected with such permane establishment. In such case the provisions of Article 7 shall apply.

5. Royalties shall be deemed to arise in a Contracting State when the payer is a resident that State. Where, however, the person paying the royalties, whether he is a resident of a Contracting State or not, has in a Contracting State a permanent establishment with which the right or property in respect of which the royalties are paid is effectively connected, and such royalties are borne by such permanent establishment, then such royalties shall be deemed to a in the State in which the permanent establishment is situated.

6. Where, by reason of a special relationship between the payer and the beneficial owner between both of them and some other person, the amount of the royalties paid exceeds, for whatever reason, the amount which would have been agreed upon by the payer and the benefit owner in the absence of such relationship, the provisions of this Article shall apply only to the last-mentioned amount. In such case, the excess part of the payments shall remain taxable according to the laws of each Contracting State, due regard being had to the other provisions of this Convention.

7. No relief shall be available under this Article if it was the main purpose or one of the main purposes of any person concerned with the creation or assignment of the rights in respect which the royalties are paid to take advantage of this Article by means of that creation or assignment.

Article 13

Capital Gains

1. Gains derived by a resident of a Contracting State from the alienation of immovable property referred to in Article 6 and situated in the other Contracting State may be taxed in the other State.

2. Gains derived by a resident of a Contracting State from the alienation of shares, othe shares in which there is substantial and regular trading on a Stock Exchange, or comparable interests, deriving more than 50 per cent of their value directly or indirectly from immovable property situated in the other Contracting State may be taxed in that other State.

3. Gains from the alienation of movable property forming part of the business property permanent establishment which an enterprise of a Contracting State has in the other Contracti State, including such gains from the alienation of such a permanent establishment (alone or w the whole enterprise), may be taxed in that other State.

4. Gains derived by a resident of a Contracting State from the alienation of ships, aircra road transport vehicles operated in international traffic by an enterprise of that State or moval property pertaining to the operation of such ships, aircraft or vehicles shall be taxable only in State.

5. Gains from the alienation of any property other than that referred to in paragraphs 1, and 4 shall be taxable only in the Contracting State of which the alienator is a resident.

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 5, a Contracting State may, in accordan with its laws, levy tax on gains derived by an individual who is a resident of the other Contracting State from the alienation of shares or other rights in a company which is a resident of the first mentioned State if:

- a) he was a resident of the first mentioned State for at least five years in the ten year per preceding the date upon which he became a resident of the other Contracting State;
- b) the alienation takes place within three years of his becoming a resident of that other Contracting State; and
- c) on ceasing to be a resident of the first mentioned State, he held shares or other rights constituted at least 10 per cent of the capital of the company.

Article 14

Income from Employment

1. Subject to the provisions of Articles 15, 17 and 18, salaries, wages and other similar remuneration derived by a resident of a Contracting State in respect of an employment shall be taxable only in that State unless the employment is exercised in the other Contracting State. If employment is so exercised, such remuneration as is derived therefrom may be taxed in that of State.

- (a) the recipient is present in the other State for a period or periods not exceeding in the aggregate 183 days in any twelve month period commencing or ending in the fiscal y concerned, and
- (b) the remuneration is paid by, or on behalf of, an employer who is not a resident of the other State, and
- (c) the remuneration is not borne by a permanent establishment which the employer has the other State.

3. Notwithstanding the preceding provisions of this Article, remuneration derived by a resident of a Contracting State in respect of an employment exercised aboard a ship, aircraft or road transport vehicle operated in international traffic (other than aboard a ship, aircraft or veloperated solely within the other Contracting State) shall be taxable only in the first-mentioned State.

Article 15

Directors' Fees

Directors' fees and other similar payments derived by a resident of a Contracting State is capacity as a member of the board of directors or any similar organ of a company which resident of the other Contracting State may be taxed in that other State.

Article 16

Entertainers and Sportsmen

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Articles 7 and 14, income derived by a resident of Contracting State as an entertainer, such as a theatre, motion picture, radio or television artiste a musician, or as a sportsman, from his personal activities as such exercised in the other Contracting State, may be taxed in that other State.

2. Where income in respect of personal activities exercised by an entertainer or a sports in his capacity as such accrues not to the entertainer or sportsman himself but to another perso that income may, notwithstanding the provisions of Articles 7 and 14, be taxed in the Contrac State in which the activities of the entertainer or sportsman are exercised.

Article 17

Pensions

1. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 of Article 18, pensions and other similar remuneration paid to a resident of a Contracting State shall be taxable only in that State. How where such pensions and other similar remuneration arising in the other Contracting State are subject to tax in the first-mentioned State, that other Contracting State may tax such income.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1, pensions and other similar remunerat paid under a public scheme which is part of the social security system of a Contracting State s

Article 18

Government Service

1. (a) Salaries, wages and other similar remuneration paid by a Contracting State of political subdivision or a local authority thereof to an individual in respect of services rendered that State or subdivision or authority shall be taxable only in that State.

(b) However, such salaries, wages and other similar remuneration shall be taxab only in the other Contracting State if the services are rendered in that State and the individual resident of that State who:

- (i) is a national of that State; or
- (ii) did not become a resident of that State solely for the purpose of rendering the services,

and is subject to tax in that State on such salaries, wages and other similar remuneration.

2. (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1, pensions and other similar remuneration paid by, or out of funds created by, a Contracting State or a political subdivision local authority thereof to an individual in respect of services rendered to that State or subdivis or authority shall be taxable only in that State.

(b) However, such pensions and other similar remuneration shall be taxable only the other Contracting State if the individual is a resident of, and a national of, that other State.

3. The provisions of Articles 14, 15, 16 and 17 shall apply to salaries, wages, pensions a other similar remuneration, in respect of services rendered in connection with a business carried on by a Contracting State or a political subdivision or a local authority thereof.

Article 19

Students

Payments which a student or business apprentice who is or was immediately before visit Contracting State a resident of the other Contracting State and who is present in the mentioned State solely for the purpose of his education or training receives for the purpose maintenance, education or training shall not be taxed in that State, provided that such payn arise from sources outside that State.

Article 20

Other Income

1. Items of income beneficially owned by a resident of a Contracting State, wherever arising, not dealt with in the foregoing Articles of this Convention shall be taxable only in tha State.

Any tax paid by the trustees or personal representatives in respect of the income paid t beneficiary shall be treated as if it had been paid by the beneficiary.

3. The provisions of paragraph 1 shall not apply to income, other than income from immovable property as defined in paragraph 2 of Article 6, if the beneficial owner of such income being a resident of a Contracting State, carries on business in the other Contracting State through permanent establishment situated therein, and the right or property in respect of which the income is paid is effectively connected with such permanent establishment. In such case, the provision Article 7 shall apply.

4. Where, by reason of a special relationship between the resident referred to in paragra and some other person, or between both of them and some third person, the amount of the inc referred to in that paragraph exceeds the amount (if any) which would have been agreed upon between them in the absence of such a relationship, the provisions of this Article shall apply of to the last-mentioned amount. In such a case, the excess part of the income shall remain taxal according to the laws of each Contracting State, due regard being had to the other applicable provisions of this Convention.

5. No relief shall be available under this Article if it was the main purpose or one of the main purposes of any person concerned with the creation or assignment of the rights in respect which the income is paid to take advantage of this Article by means of that creation or assignment.

CHAPTER IV

METHODS FOR ELIMINATION OF DOUBLE TAXATION

Article 21

Elimination of Double Taxation

- 1. In Bulgaria double taxation shall be eliminated as follows:
 - (a) where a resident of Bulgaria derives income which, in accordance with the provision this Convention, may be taxed in the United Kingdom, Bulgaria shall allow as a deduction from the tax on the income of that resident, an amount equal to the tax on to income or capital gains paid in the United Kingdom. Such deduction shall not, however exceed that part of the income tax, as computed before the deduction is given, which attributable to the income which may be taxed in the United Kingdom.
 - (b) where in accordance with any provision of this Convention income derived by a resid of Bulgaria is exempt from tax in Bulgaria, Bulgaria may nevertheless, in calculating amount of tax on the remaining income of such resident, take into account the exemp income.

2. Subject to the provisions of the law of the United Kingdom regarding the allowance a credit against United Kingdom tax of tax payable in a territory outside the United Kingdom of the case may be, regarding the exemption from United Kingdom tax of a dividend arising in a territory outside the United Kingdom or of the profits of a permanent establishment situated in territory outside the United Kingdom (which shall not affect the general principle hereof):

- (a) Bulgarian tax payable under the laws of Bulgaria and in accordance with this Conver whether directly or by deduction, on profits, income or chargeable gains from source within Bulgaria (excluding, in the case of a dividend, tax payable in respect of the proout of which the dividend is paid) shall be allowed as a credit against any United Kingdom tax computed by reference to the same profits, income or chargeable gains reference to which the Bulgarian tax is computed;
- (b) a dividend which is paid by a company which is a resident of Bulgaria to a company which is a resident of the United Kingdom shall be exempted from United Kingdom when the conditions for exemption under the law of the United Kingdom are met;
- (c) the profits of a permanent establishment in Bulgaria of a company which is a residen the United Kingdom shall be exempted from United Kingdom tax when the exemption applicable and the conditions for exemption under the law of the United Kingdom are met;
- (d) in the case of a dividend not exempted from tax under sub-paragraph (b) which is pair a company which is a resident of Bulgaria to a company which is a resident of the Un Kingdom and which controls directly or indirectly at least 10 per cent of the voting p in the company paying the dividend, the credit mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) above shall also take into account the Bulgarian tax payable by the company in respect of it profits out of which such dividend is paid.

3. For the purposes of paragraphs 1 and 2, profits, income and gains owned by a resider a Contracting State which may be taxed in the other Contracting State in accordance with this Convention shall be deemed to arise from sources in that other State.

Article 22

Limitation of relief

Where under any provision of this Convention any income or gains are relieved from tax Contracting State and, under the law in force in the other Contracting State a person, in resp that income or those gains, is subject to tax by reference to the amount thereof which is remit or received in that other State and not by reference to the full amount thereof, then the relief allowed under this Convention in the first-mentioned State shall apply only to so much o income or gains as is taxed in the other State.

CHAPTER V

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Article 23

Non-discrimination

 Nationals of a Contracting State shall not be subjected in the other Contracting State any taxation or any requirement connected therewith which is other or more burdensome than taxation and connected requirements to which nationals of that other State in the same 2. The taxation on a permanent establishment which an enterprise of a Contracting State in the other Contracting State shall not be less favourably levied in that other State than the taxation levied on enterprises of that other State carrying on the same activities.

3. Except where the provisions of paragraph 1 of Article 9, paragraph 7 or 8 of Article 1 paragraph 6 or 7 of Article 12 or paragraph 4 or 5 of Article 20 apply, interest, royalties and or disbursements paid by an enterprise of a Contracting State to a resident of the other Contracting State shall, for the purpose of determining the taxable profits of the first-mentioned resident, I deductible under the same conditions as if they had been paid to a resident of the first-mention State.

4. Enterprises of a Contracting State, the capital of which is wholly or partly owned or controlled, directly or indirectly, by one or more residents of the other Contracting State, shal be subjected in the first-mentioned State to any taxation or any requirement connected therew which is other or more burdensome than the taxation and connected requirements to which ot similar enterprises of the first-mentioned State are or may be subjected.

5. Nothing contained in this Article shall be construed as obliging either Contracting Stagrant to individuals not resident in that State any of the personal allowances, reliefs and reduct for tax purposes which are granted to individuals so resident or to its nationals.

Article 24

Mutual Agreement Procedure

1. Where a person considers that the actions of one or both of the Contracting States resort will result for him in taxation not in accordance with the provisions of this Convention, he irrespective of the remedies provided by the domestic law of those States, present his case to a competent authority of the Contracting State of which he is a resident or, if his case comes un paragraph 1 of Article 23, to that of the Contracting State of which he is a national. The case be presented within three years from the first notification of the action resulting in taxation not accordance with the provisions of the Convention.

2. The competent authority shall endeavour, if the objection appears to it to be justified if it is not itself able to arrive at a satisfactory solution, to resolve the case by mutual agreeme with the competent authority of the other Contracting State, with a view to the avoidance of taxation which is not in accordance with the Convention. Any agreement reached shall be implemented notwithstanding any time limits in the domestic law of the Contracting States.

3. The competent authorities of the Contracting States shall endeavour to resolve by mu agreement any difficulties or doubts arising as to the interpretation or application of the Convention. They may also consult together for the elimination of double taxation in cases ne provided for in the Convention.

 The competent authorities of the Contracting States may communicate with each othe directly for the purpose of reaching an agreement in the sense of the preceding paragraphs.

Article 25

Exchange of Information

2. Any information received under paragraph 1 by a Contracting State shall be treated a secret in the same manner as information obtained under the domestic laws of that State and s be disclosed only to persons or authorities (including courts and administrative bodies) concer with the assessment or collection of, the enforcement or prosecution in respect of, the determination of appeals in relation to the taxes referred to in paragraph 1, or the oversight of above. Such persons or authorities shall use the information only for such purposes. They may disclose the information in public court proceedings or in judicial decisions. Notwithstanding foregoing, information received by a Contracting State may be used for other purposes when information may be used for such other purposes under the laws of both States and the compet authority of the supplying State authorises such use.

3. In no case shall the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 be construed so as to impose on Contracting State the obligation:

- (a) to carry out administrative measures at variance with the laws and administrative praof that or of the other Contracting State;
- (b) to supply information which is not obtainable under the laws or in the normal course the administration of that or of the other Contracting State;
- (c) to supply information which would disclose any trade, business, industrial, commerci professional secret or trade process, or information the disclosure of which would be contrary to public policy.

4. If information is requested by a Contracting State in accordance with this Article, the other Contracting State shall use its information gathering measures to obtain the requested information, even though that other State may not need such information for its own tax purp. The obligation contained in the preceding sentence is subject to the limitations of paragraph 3 in no case shall such limitations be construed to permit a Contracting State to decline to suppl information solely because it has no domestic tax interest in such information.

5. In no case shall the provisions of paragraph 3 be construed to permit a Contracting Set to decline to supply information solely because the information is held by a bank, other finance institution, nominee or person acting in an agency or a fiduciary capacity or because it relates ownership interests in a person.

Article 26

Assistance in the Collection of Taxes

1. The Contracting States shall lend assistance to each other in the collection of revenue claims. This assistance is not restricted by Articles 1 and 2. The competent authorities of the Contracting States may by mutual agreement settle the mode of application of this Article.

2. The term "revenue claim" as used in this Article means an amount owed in respect of taxes of every kind and description imposed on behalf of the Contracting States, or of their political subdivisions or local authorities, insofar as the taxation thereunder is not contrary to Convention or any other instrument to which the Contracting States are parties, as well as interadministrative penalties and costs of collection or conservancy related to such amount.

4. When a revenue claim of a Contracting State is a claim in respect of which that State under its law, take measures of conservancy with a view to ensure its collection, that revenue claim shall, at the request of the competent authority of that State, be accepted for purposes of taking measures of conservancy by the competent authority of the other Contracting State. The other State shall take measures of conservancy in respect of that revenue claim in accordance the provisions of its laws as if the revenue claim were a revenue claim of that other State even at the time when such measures are applied, the revenue claim is not enforceable in the first-mentioned State or is owed by a person who has a right to prevent its collection.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs 3 and 4, a revenue claim accepted by a Contracting State for purposes of paragraph 3 or 4 shall not, in that State, be subject to the tin limits or accorded any priority applicable to a revenue claim under the laws of that State by re of its nature as such. In addition, a revenue claim accepted by a Contracting State for the purp of paragraph 3 or 4 shall not, in that State, have any priority applicable to that revenue claim the laws of the other Contracting State.

 Proceedings with respect to the existence, validity or the amount of a revenue claim of Contracting State shall not be brought before the courts or administrative bodies of the other Contracting State.

7. Where, at any time after a request has been made by a Contracting State under parage 3 or 4 and before the other Contracting State has collected and remitted the relevant revenue of to the first-mentioned State, the relevant revenue claim ceases to be:

- (a) in the case of a request under paragraph 3, a revenue claim of the first-mentioned Sta that is enforceable under the laws of that State and is owed by a person who, at that to cannot, under the laws of that State, prevent its collection, or
- (b) in the case of a request under paragraph 4, a revenue claim of the first-mentioned Sta respect of which that State may, under its laws, take measures of conservancy with a to ensure its collection,

the competent authority of the first-mentioned State shall promptly notify the competent auth of the other State of that fact and, at the option of the other State, the first-mentioned State either suspend or withdraw its request.

8. In no case shall the provisions of this Article be construed so as to impose on a Contracting State the obligation:

- (a) to carry out administrative measures at variance with the laws and administrative praof that or of the other Contracting State;
- (b) to carry out measures which would be contrary to public policy;
- (c) to provide assistance if the other Contracting State has not pursued all reasonable measures of collection or conservancy, as the case may be, available under its laws o administrative practice;
- (d) to provide assistance in those cases where the administrative burden for that State is

Article 27

Members of Diplomatic Missions and Consular Posts

Nothing in this Convention shall affect the fiscal privileges of members of diplomatic missic consular posts under the general rules of international law or under the provisions of sp agreements.

CHAPTER VI

FINAL PROVISIONS

Article 28

Entry into Force

 Each of the Contracting States shall notify the other, through diplomatic channels, of completion of the procedures required by its law for the bringing into force of this Convention The Convention shall enter into force on the date of the later of these notifications and shall thereupon have effect:

a) in Bulgaria:

- in respect of taxes withheld at source, for amounts paid or credited on or after 1st January of the calendar year next following that in which the Convention enters into force;
- (ii) in respect of other taxes, for taxable years beginning on or after 1st Janu of the calendar year next following that in which the Convention enters force;
- b) in the United Kingdom:
 - in respect of income tax and capital gains tax, for any year of assessmen beginning on or after 6th April in the calendar year next following that i which the Convention enters into force;
 - (ii) in respect of corporation tax, for any financial year beginning on or after April in the calendar year next following that in which the Convention e into force;
 - (iii) in respect of taxes withheld at source, for amounts paid or credited on or after 1st January in the calendar year next following that in which the Convention enters into force.

2. Notwithstanding paragraph 1, the provisions of Article 24 (Mutual Agreement Procedure), Article 25 (Exchange of Information) and Article 26 (Assistance in the Collection Taxes) shall have effect from the date of entry into force of this Convention, without regard to taxable period to which the matter relates. 4. Notwithstanding the entry into force of this Convention, an individual who is entitled the benefits of Article 20 (Teachers, etc.) of the prior Convention at the time of entry into force this Convention shall continue to be entitled to such benefits until such time as the individual would have ceased to be entitled to such benefits if the prior Convention had remained in force the prior Convention had rema

Article 29

Termination

1. This Convention shall remain in force until terminated by one of the Contracting Stat Either Contracting State may terminate this Convention, through diplomatic channels, by give notice of termination at least six months before the end of any calendar year beginning after the expiry of five years from the date of entry into force of this Convention.

- 2. In such event, this Convention shall cease to have effect:
 - (a) in Bulgaria:
 - in respect of taxes withheld at source, for amounts paid or credited on or after 1st January in the calendar year next following that in which the ne is given;
 - (ii) in respect of other taxes, for taxable years beginning on or after 1st Janu in the calendar year next following that in which the notice is given;
 - b) in the United Kingdom:
 - in respect of income tax and capital gains tax, for any year of assessmen beginning on or after 6th April in the calendar year next following that i which the notice is given;
 - (ii) in respect of corporation tax, for any financial year beginning on or after April in the calendar year next following that in which the notice is give
 - (iii) in respect of taxes withheld at source, for amounts paid or credited on or after 1st January in the calendar year next following that in which the no is given.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

The Schedule to this Order contains a Convention ("the Arrangements") between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria dealing with the avoidance of double taxation and the prevention of fiscal evasion. This Order brings the Arrangements into effect.

The Arrangements aim to eliminate the double taxation of income and gains arising in one country and paid to residents of the other country. This is done by allocating the taxing rights that each country has under its domestic law over the same income and gains, and/or by providing relief from double taxation. There are also specific measures which combat discriminatory tax treatment and provide for assistance in international tax enforcement.

Article 1 provides for citation.

Article 2 makes a declaration as to the effect and content of the Arrangements.

The Arrangements will enter into force on the date of the later of the notifications by each country of the completion of its legislative procedures. They will take effect as follows:

- (a) in respect of taxes withheld at source, to amounts paid or credited on or after 1st January next following the date of entry into force;
- (b) in Bulgaria, in respect of other taxes for taxable years beginning on or after 1st January next following the date of entry into force;
- (c) in the United Kingdom:
 - (i) subject to paragraph (a) above, in respect of income tax and capital gains tax, for any year of assessment beginning on or after 6th April next following the date of entry into force; and
 - (ii) in respect of corporation tax, for any financial year beginning on or after 1st April next following the date of entry into force.

Until such time as the Arrangements enter into force, the Convention set out in the Double Taxation Relief (Taxes on Income) (Bulgaria) Order 1987 (S.I. 1987/2054), continues to have effect.

The date of entry into force will, in due course, be published in the *London, Edinburgh* and *Belfast Gazettes*.

A Tax Information and Impact Note has not been produced for this Order as it gives effect to a previously announced policy to enact a double taxation agreement.
