ROAD TRAFFIC

The M6 Toll Motorway (Junctions T3 to T4) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2016

Made 1st August 2016

Coming into force 8th August 2016

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Toll Motorway ("the M6 Toll") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and one of those connecting roads, near Sutton Coldfield, in the Counties of Warwickshire and Staffordshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The M6 Toll Motorway (Junctions T3 to T4) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2016 and shall come into force on Monday 8th August 2016.

2. In this Order -

"the motorway" means the northbound carriageway of the M6 Toll from

its junction with the exit slip road at Junction T3 to its

junction with the entry slip road at Junction T4;

"a slip road" means the slip road leading to the northbound

carriageway of the M6 Toll at Junction T3;

"the works period" means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Saturday 13th

August 2016 and ending when the said works have been

completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway or the slip road.

- **4.** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle
 - a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
 - b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable; or
 - c) being used in connection with the said works; or
 - d) being driven by, or at the direction of, a traffic officer in uniform
