The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 62(2B) and 76(3) of the Criminal Justice and Court Services Act $2000(\mathbf{a})$, makes the following Order.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Electronic Monitoring (Responsible Persons) (Amendment) Order 2018 and comes into force on 10th January 2019.

Amendment to the Electronic Monitoring (Responsible Persons) Order 2018

2.—(1) Article 3(a) of the Electronic Monitoring (Responsible Persons) Order 2018(b) is amended as follows.

(2) For sub-paragraph (ii), substitute—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order amends the Electronic Monitoring (Responsible Persons) Order 2018 (S.I. 2018/212) which lists the persons that may be made responsible for the monitoring of individuals under section 62 (Release on licence etc.: electronic monitoring conditions) of the Criminal Justice and Court Services Act 2000 (c. 43), as required under section 62(2B) of that Act.

Article 2(a)(ii) of this Order amends the details of one of the existing persons listed, and Article 2(a)(iii) adds a further person that may be made responsible.

A full impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no, or no significant, impact on the private, voluntary or public sector is foreseen.
