At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 23rd day of May 2018 Present, The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

A draft of this Order was laid before the House of Commons in accordance with section 5(2) of the Taxation (International and Other Provisions) Act 2010(1) and approved by resolution of that House.

Accordingly, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 2 of the Taxation (International and Other Provisions) Act 2010, orders as follows—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Double Taxation Relief (Base Erosion and Profit Shifting) Order 2018.

Double taxation and international enforcement arrangements to have effect

- 2. It is declared that—
 - (a) The arrangements specified in the Convention set out in the Schedule to this Order have been made;
 - (b) The arrangements have been made with a view to affording relief from double taxation in relation to capital gains tax, corporation tax and income tax and taxes of a similar character imposed by the laws of territories outside of the United Kingdom; and
 - (c) It is expedient that those arrangements should have effect.

Status: This is the original version (as it was originally made). This item of legislation is currently only available in its original format.

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SCHEDULE

Article 2

MULTILATERAL CONVENTION

TO IMPLEMENT TAX TREATY RELATED MEASURES

TO PREVENT BASE EROSION AND PROFIT SHIFTING

The Parties to this Convention,

Recognising that governments lose substantial corporate tax revenue because of aggressive international tax planning that has the effect of artificially shifting profits to locations where are subject to non-taxation or reduced taxation;

Mindful that base erosion and profit shifting (hereinafter referred to as "BEPS") is a pressing not only for industrialised countries but also for emerging economies and developing countri

Recognising the importance of ensuring that profits are taxed where substantive economic activities generating the profits are carried out and where value is created;

Welcoming the package of measures developed under the OECD/G20 BEPS project (herein referred to as the "OECD/G20 BEPS package");

Noting that the OECD/G20 BEPS package included tax treaty-related measures to address c hybrid mismatch arrangements, prevent treaty abuse, address artificial avoidance of permane establishment status, and improve dispute resolution;

Conscious of the need to ensure swift, co-ordinated and consistent implementation of the tre related BEPS measures in a multilateral context;

Noting the need to ensure that existing agreements for the avoidance of double taxation on it are interpreted to eliminate double taxation with respect to the taxes covered by those agreent without creating opportunities for non-taxation or reduced taxation through tax evasion or avoidance (including through treaty-shopping arrangements aimed at obtaining reliefs provithose agreements for the indirect benefit of residents of third jurisdictions);

Recognising the need for an effective mechanism to implement agreed changes in a synchro and efficient manner across the network of existing agreements for the avoidance of double taxation on income without the need to bilaterally renegotiate each such agreement;

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Have agreed as follows:

This Convention modifies all Covered Tax Agreements as defined in subparagraph a) of par 1 of Article 2 (Interpretation of Terms).

Article 2

Interpretation of Terms

1. For the purpose of this Convention, the following definitions apply:

 a) The term "Covered Tax Agreement" means an agreement for the avoidance of doubt taxation with respect to taxes on income (whether or not other taxes are also covere

- i) that is in force between two or more:
- A) Parties; and/or

B) jurisdictions or territories which are parties to an agreement described above and fo whose international relations a Party is responsible; and

ii) with respect to which each such Party has made a notification to the Depositary listing the agreement as well as any amending or accompanying instruments the (identified by title, names of the parties, date of signature, and, if applicable at time of the notification, date of entry into force) as an agreement which it wishe be covered by this Convention.

b) The term "Party" means:

- A State for which this Convention is in force pursuant to Article 34 (Entry into Force); or
- A jurisdiction which has signed this Convention pursuant to subparagraph b) or paragraph 1 of Article 27 (Signature and Ratification, Acceptance or Approval) for which this Convention is in force pursuant to Article 34 (Entry into Force).
- c) The term "Contracting Jurisdiction" means a party to a Covered Tax Agreement.
- d) The term "Signatory" means a State or jurisdiction which has signed this Convention for which the Convention is not yet in force.

2. As regards the application of this Convention at any time by a Party, any term not d herein shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meaning that it has at that time t the relevant Covered Tax Agreement.

Part II. Hybrid Mismatches

Article 3

Transparent Entities

1. For the purposes of a Covered Tax Agreement, income derived by or through an en arrangement that is treated as wholly or partly fiscally transparent under the tax law of either Contracting Jurisdiction shall be considered to be income of a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction but only to the extent that the income is treated, for purposes of taxation by that Contracting Jurisdiction, as the income of a resident of that Contracting Jurisdiction.

2. Provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that require a Contracting Jurisdiction to exfrom income tax or provide a deduction or credit equal to the income tax paid with respect to income derived by a resident of that Contracting Jurisdiction which may be taxed in the other Contracting Jurisdiction according to the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement shall not to the extent that such provisions allow taxation by that other Contracting Jurisdiction solely because the income is also income derived by a resident of that other Contracting Jurisdiction

3. With respect to Covered Tax Agreements for which one or more Parties has made to reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragraph 3 of Article 11 (Application of Tax Agreements to Restrict a Party's Right to Tax its Own Residents), the following sentence we added at the end of paragraph 1: "In no case shall the provisions of this paragraph be construct affect a Contracting Jurisdiction's right to tax the residents of that Contracting Jurisdiction."

4. Paragraph 1 (as it may be modified by paragraph 3) shall apply in place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement to the extent that they address whether i derived by or through entities or arrangements that are treated as fiscally transparent under t law of either Contracting Jurisdiction (whether through a general rule or by identifying in de the treatment of specific fact patterns and types of entities or arrangements) shall be treated income of a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction.

- 5. A Party may reserve the right:
 - a) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
 - b) for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain a provision described in paragraph 4;
 - c) for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain a provision described in paragraph 4 which denies treaty benefits in the case of incon derived by or through an entity or arrangement established in a third jurisdiction;
 - d) for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain a provision described in paragraph 4 which identifies in detail the treatment of specifi patterns and types of entities or arrangements;
 - e) for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain a provision described in paragraph 4 which identifies in detail the treatment of specifi patterns and types of entities or arrangements and denies treaty benefits in the case

6. Each Party that has not made a reservation described in subparagraph a) or b) of paragraph 5 shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements con provision described in paragraph 4 that is not subject to a reservation under subparagraphs c through e) of paragraph 5, and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision the case of a Party that has made the reservation described in subparagraph g) of paragraph 1 notification pursuant to the preceding sentence shall be limited to Covered Tax Agreements are subject to that reservation. Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement, that provision shall be replaced by provisions of paragraph 1 (as it may be modified by paragraph 3) to the extent provided in paragraph 4. In other cases, paragraph 1 (as it may be modified by paragraph 3) shall supers the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent that those provisions are incompatible with paragraph 1 (as it may be modified by paragraph 3).

Article 4

Dual Resident Entities

1. Where by reason of the provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement a person other than individual is a resident of more than one Contracting Jurisdiction, the competent authorities Contracting Jurisdictions shall endeavour to determine by mutual agreement the Contracting Jurisdiction of which such person shall be deemed to be a resident for the purposes of the Co Tax Agreement, having regard to its place of effective management, the place where it is incorporated or otherwise constituted and any other relevant factors. In the absence of such agreement, such person shall not be entitled to any relief or exemption from tax provided by Covered Tax Agreement except to the extent and in such manner as may be agreed upon by competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions.

2. Paragraph 1 shall apply in place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that provide rules for determining whether a person other than an individual shal treated as a resident of one of the Contracting Jurisdictions in cases in which that person wo otherwise be treated as a resident of more than one Contracting Jurisdiction. Paragraph 1 sha apply, however, to provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement specifically addressing the resid of companies participating in dual-listed company arrangements.

3. A Party may reserve the right:

- a) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
- b) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that alreat address cases where a person other than an individual is a resident of more than one Contracting Jurisdiction by requiring the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions to endeavour to reach mutual agreement on a single Contracting Jurisdiction of residence;
- c) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that alrea address cases where a person other than an individual is a resident of more than one Contracting Jurisdiction by denying treaty benefits without requiring the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions to endeavour to reach mutual agreement single Contracting Jurisdiction of residence;
- d) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that alrea address cases where a person other than an individual is a resident of more than one Contracting Jurisdiction by requiring the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions to endeavour to reach mutual agreement on a single Contracting Jurisd of residence, and that set out the treatment of that person under the Covered Tax Agreement where such an agreement cannot be reached;
- e) to replace the last sentence of paragraph 1 with the following text for the purposes of Covered Tax Agreements: "In the absence of such agreement, such person shall not entitled to any relief or exemption from tax provided by the Covered Tax Agreement
- f) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements with Part that have made the reservation described in subparagraph e).

4. Each Party that has not made a reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragraph shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements contains a provise described in paragraph 2 that is not subject to a reservation under subparagraphs b) through paragraph 3, and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification with respect to a provision of a Coveragraph 1 shall supersede the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent those provisions are incompatible with paragraph 1.

Article 5

Application of Methods for Elimination of Double Taxation

1. A Party may choose to apply either paragraphs 2 and 3 (Option A), paragraphs 4 an (Option B), or paragraphs 6 and 7 (Option C), or may choose to apply none of the Options. Veach Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement chooses a different Option (or w one Contracting Jurisdiction chooses to apply an Option and the other chooses to apply none the Options), the Option chosen by each Contracting Jurisdiction shall apply with respect to own residents.

Option A

2. Provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that would otherwise exempt income deriv capital owned by a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction from tax in that Contracting Jurisdic for the purpose of eliminating double taxation shall not apply where the other Contracting Jurisdiction applies the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement to exempt such income or capital from tax or to limit the rate at which such income or capital may be taxed. In the latted case, the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction shall allow as a deduction from the tax on income or capital of that resident an amount equal to the tax paid in that other Contracting Jurisdiction. Such deduction shall not, however, exceed that part of the tax, as computed bef the deduction is given, which is attributable to such items of income or capital which may be in that other Contracting Jurisdiction.

 Paragraph 2 shall apply to a Covered Tax Agreement that would otherwise require a Contracting Jurisdiction to exempt income or capital described in that paragraph.

Option B

4. Provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that would otherwise exempt income deriv a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction from tax in that Contracting Jurisdiction for the purp eliminating double taxation because such income is treated as a dividend by that Contracting Jurisdiction shall not apply where such income gives rise to a deduction for the purpose of determining the taxable profits of a resident of the other Contracting Jurisdiction under the I that other Contracting Jurisdiction. In such case, the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction allow as a deduction from the tax on the income of that resident an amount equal to the inco paid in that other Contracting Jurisdiction. Such deduction shall not, however, exceed that p the income tax, as computed before the deduction is given, which is attributable to such inco which may be taxed in that other Contracting Jurisdiction.

5. Paragraph 4 shall apply to a Covered Tax Agreement that would otherwise require a Contracting Jurisdiction to exempt income described in that paragraph.

Option C

6. a) Where a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction derives income or owns capital which may be taxed in the other Contracting Jurisdiction in accordance with provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement (except to the extent that these proviallow taxation by that other Contracting Jurisdiction solely because the incom also income derived by a resident of that other Contracting Jurisdiction), the mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction shall allow:

Such deduction shall not, however, exceed that part of the income tax or capital tax, as con before the deduction is given, which is attributable to the income or the capital which r taxed in that other Contracting Jurisdiction.

b) Where in accordance with any provision of the Covered Tax Agreement income denor capital owned by a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction is exempt from tax in the Contracting Jurisdiction, such Contracting Jurisdiction may nevertheless, in calcula the amount of tax on the remaining income or capital of such resident, take into acc the exempted income or capital.

7. Paragraph 6 shall apply in place of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that, for purposes of eliminating double taxation, require a Contracting Jurisdiction to exempt from ta that Contracting Jurisdiction income derived or capital owned by a resident of that Contracti Jurisdiction which, in accordance with the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement, may be taxed in the other Contracting Jurisdiction.

8. A Party that does not choose to apply an Option under paragraph 1 may reserve the for the entirety of this Article not to apply with respect to one or more identified Covered Ta Agreements (or with respect to all of its Covered Tax Agreements).

9. A Party that does not choose to apply Option C may reserve the right, with respect or more identified Covered Tax Agreements (or with respect to all of its Covered Tax Agreements), not to permit the other Contracting Jurisdiction(s) to apply Option C.

10. Each Party that chooses to apply an Option under paragraph 1 shall notify the Depo of its choice of Option. Such notification shall also include:

- a) in the case of a Party that chooses to apply Option A, the list of its Covered Tax Agreements which contain a provision described in paragraph 3, as well as the artic paragraph number of each such provision;
- b) in the case of a Party that chooses to apply Option B, the list of its Covered Tax Agreements which contain a provision described in paragraph 5, as well as the artic paragraph number of each such provision;
- c) in the case of a Party that chooses to apply Option C, the list of its Covered Tax Agreements which contain a provision described in paragraph 7, as well as the artic paragraph number of each such provision.

An Option shall apply with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement only wh Party that has chosen to apply that Option has made such a notification with respect provision.

Part III. Treaty Abuse
Article 6
Purpose of a Covered Tax Agreement
1. A Covered Tax Agreement shall be modified to include the following preamble tex
"Intending to eliminate double taxation with respect to the taxes covered by this agreement without creating opportunities for non-taxation or reduced taxation through tax evasion or avoidance (including through treaty-shopping arrangements aimed at obtaining reliefs provi this agreement for the indirect benefit of residents of third jurisdictions),".
2. The text described in paragraph 1 shall be included in a Covered Tax Agreement in of or in the absence of preamble language of the Covered Tax Agreement referring to an inte eliminate double taxation, whether or not that language also refers to the intent not to create opportunities for non-taxation or reduced taxation.
3. A Party may also choose to include the following preamble text with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements that do not contain preamble language referring to a desire to deve economic relationship or to enhance co-operation in tax matters:
"Desiring to further develop their economic relationship and to enhance their co-operation in matters,".
4. A Party may reserve the right for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agree that already contain preamble language describing the intent of the Contracting Jurisdictions eliminate double taxation without creating opportunities for non-taxation or reduced taxation whether that language is limited to cases of tax evasion or avoidance (including through treat shopping arrangements aimed at obtaining reliefs provided in the Covered Tax Agreement for indirect benefit of residents of third jurisdictions) or applies more broadly.
5. Each Party shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreement other than those that are within the scope of a reservation under paragraph 4, contains pream language described in paragraph 2, and if so, the text of the relevant preambular paragraph. all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification with respect to that preamble language such preamble language shall be replaced by the text described in paragraph 1. In other case text described in paragraph 1 shall be included in addition to the existing preamble language
6. Each Party that chooses to apply paragraph 3 shall notify the Depositary of its choic Such notification shall also include the list of its Covered Tax Agreements that do not alread contain preamble language referring to a desire to develop an economic relationship or to en

contain preamble language referring to a desire to develop an economic relationship or to er co-operation in tax matters. The text described in paragraph 3 shall be included in a Covered Agreement only where all Contracting Jurisdictions have chosen to apply that paragraph and made such a notification with respect to the Covered Tax Agreement.

Article 7

Prevention of Treaty Abuse

1. Notwithstanding any provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement, a benefit under the Covered Tax Agreement shall not be granted in respect of an item of income or capital if it is reasonable to conclude, having regard to all relevant facts and circumstances, that obtaining benefit was one of the principal purposes of any arrangement or transaction that resulted dire or indirectly in that benefit, unless it is established that granting that benefit in these circums would be in accordance with the object and purpose of the relevant provisions of the Covere Agreement.

2. Paragraph 1 shall apply in place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that deny all or part of the benefits that would otherwise be provided under the Covered Tax Agreement where the principal purpose or one of the principal purposes of any arrangement or transaction, or of any person concerned with an arrangement or transaction, obtain those benefits.

3. A Party that has not made the reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragraph may also choose to apply paragraph 4 with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements.

4. Where a benefit under a Covered Tax Agreement is denied to a person under provis of the Covered Tax Agreement (as it may be modified by this Convention) that deny all or p the benefits that would otherwise be provided under the Covered Tax Agreement where the principal purpose or one of the principal purposes of any arrangement or transaction, or of a person concerned with an arrangement or transaction, was to obtain those benefits, the comp authority of the Contracting Jurisdiction that would otherwise have granted this benefit shall nevertheless treat that person as being entitled to this benefit, or to different benefits with reto a specific item of income or capital, if such competent authority, upon request from that p and after consideration of the relevant facts and circumstances, determines that such benefits would have been granted to that person in the absence of the transaction or arrangement. The competent authority of the Contracting Jurisdiction to which a request has been made under paragraph by a resident of the other Contracting Jurisdiction shall consult with the competer authority of that other Contracting Jurisdiction before rejecting the request.

5. Paragraph 4 shall apply to provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement (as it may be me by this Convention) that deny all or part of the benefits that would otherwise be provided un the Covered Tax Agreement where the principal purpose or one of the principal purposes of arrangement or transaction, or of any person concerned with an arrangement or transaction, obtain those benefits.

6. A Party may also choose to apply the provisions contained in paragraphs 8 through (hereinafter referred to as the "Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision") to its Covered Agreements by making the notification described in subparagraph c) of paragraph 17. The Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision shall apply with respect to a Covered Tax Agree only where all Contracting Jurisdictions have chosen to apply it.

7. In cases where some but not all of the Contracting Jurisdictions to a Covered Tax

- a) by all Contracting Jurisdictions, if all of the Contracting Jurisdictions that do not ch pursuant to paragraph 6 to apply the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision ag such application by choosing to apply this subparagraph and notifying the Deposita accordingly; or
- b) only by the Contracting Jurisdictions that choose to apply the Simplified Limitation Benefits Provision, if all of the Contracting Jurisdictions that do not choose pursuar paragraph 6 to apply the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision agree to such application by choosing to apply this subparagraph and notifying the Depositary accordingly.

Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision

8. Except as otherwise provided in the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision, a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement shall not be entitled to a that would otherwise be accorded by the Covered Tax Agreement, other than a benefit unde provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement:

- a) which determine the residence of a person other than an individual which is a reside more than one Contracting Jurisdiction by reason of provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement that define a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction;
- b) which provide that a Contracting Jurisdiction will grant to an enterprise of that Contracting Jurisdiction a corresponding adjustment following an initial adjustment by the other Contacting Jurisdiction, in accordance with the Covered Tax Agreement the amount of tax charged in the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction on the proan associated enterprise; or
- c) which allow residents of a Contracting Jurisdiction to request that the competent au of that Contracting Jurisdiction consider cases of taxation not in accordance with th Covered Tax Agreement,

unless such resident is a "qualified person", as defined in paragraph 9 at the time that the would be accorded.

9. A resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement shall be a qua person at a time when a benefit would otherwise be accorded by the Covered Tax Agreement that time, the resident is:

- a) an individual;
- b) that Contracting Jurisdiction, or a political subdivision or local authority thereof, or agency or instrumentality of any such Contracting Jurisdiction, political subdivisior local authority;
- c) a company or other entity, if the principal class of its shares is regularly traded on o more recognised stock exchanges;

ŀ	A)	that is established and operated exclusively or almost exclusively to administer or p retirement benefits and ancillary or incidental benefits to individuals and that is regu as such by that Contracting Jurisdiction or one of its political subdivisions or local authorities; or
F	3)	that is established and operated exclusively or almost exclusively to invest funds for benefit of entities or arrangements referred to in subdivision A);
e)	a person other than an individual, if, on at least half the days of a twelve-month perit that includes the time when the benefit would otherwise be accorded, persons who a residents of that Contracting Jurisdiction and that are entitled to benefits of the Cov Tax Agreement under subparagraphs a) to d) own, directly or indirectly, at least 50 cent of the shares of the person.
10.		a) A resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement will be entitled to benefits of the Covered Tax Agreement with respect to an item of income derived from the other Contracting Jurisdiction, regardless of whethe resident is a qualified person, if the resident is engaged in the active conduct business in the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction, and the income deriv from the other Contracting Jurisdiction emanates from, or is incidental to, tha business. For purposes of the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision, th "active conduct of a business" shall not include the following activities or an combination thereof:
		i) operating as a holding company;
		ii) providing overall supervision or administration of a group of companies;
		iii) providing group financing (including cash pooling); or
		iv) making or managing investments, unless these activities are carried on by a bar insurance company or registered securities dealer in the ordinary course of its business as such.
b))	If a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement derives an it income from a business activity conducted by that resident in the other Contracting Jurisdiction, or derives an item of income arising in the other Contracting Jurisdiction from a connected person, the conditions described in subparagraph a) shall be consist to be satisfied with respect to such item only if the business activity carried on by the resident in the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction to which the item is related substantial in relation to the same activity or a complementary business activity carried by the resident or such connected person in the other Contracting Jurisdiction. Whe business activity is substantial for the purposes of this subparagraph shall be determ based on all the facts and elircumstances.
с	:)	For purposes of applying this paragraph, activities conducted by connected persons respect to a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement shal deemed to be conducted by such resident.

11. A resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement that is not a qualified person shall also be entitled to a benefit that would otherwise be accorded by the Covered Tax Agreement with respect to an item of income if, on at least half of the days of a twelve-month period that includes the time when the benefit would otherwise be accorded, persons that are equivalent beneficiaries own, directly or indirectly, at least 75 per cent of the beneficial interests of the resident.

12. If a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement is neither a qualified person pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 9, nor entitled to benefits under para 10 or 11, the competent authority of the other Contracting Jurisdiction may, nevertheless, gr benefits of the Covered Tax Agreement, or benefits with respect to a specific item of income taking into account the object and purpose of the Covered Tax Agreement, but only if such resident demonstrates to the satisfaction of such competent authority that neither its establish acquisition or maintenance, nor the conduct of its operations, had as one of its principal purp the obtaining of benefits under the Covered Tax Agreement. Before either granting or denyi request made under this paragraph by a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction, the competent authority of the other Contracting Jurisdiction to which the request has been made shall conswith the competent authority of the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction.

- 13. For the purposes of the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision:
 - a) the term "recognised stock exchange" means:
 - i) any stock exchange established and regulated as such under the laws of either Contracting Jurisdiction; and
 - any other stock exchange agreed upon by the competent authorities of the Cont Jurisdictions;
 - b) the term "principal class of shares" means the class or classes of shares of a compar which represents the majority of the aggregate vote and value of the company or the or classes of beneficial interests of an entity which represents in the aggregate a major of the aggregate vote and value of the entity;
 - c) the term "equivalent beneficiary" means any person who would be entitled to beneficiary with respect to an item of income accorded by a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Cover Tax Agreement under the domestic law of that Contracting Jurisdiction, the Covere Agreement or any other international instrument which are equivalent to, or more favourable than, benefits to be accorded to that item of income under the Covered T Agreement; for the purposes of determining whether a person is an equivalent benefic with respect to dividends, the person shall be deemed to hold the same capital of the company paying the dividends as such capital the company claiming the benefit with respect to the dividends holds;

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- d) with respect to entities that are not companies, the term "shares" means interests tha comparable to shares;
- e) two persons shall be "connected persons" if one owns, directly or indirectly, at least

14. The Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision shall apply in place of or in the abs of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that would limit the benefits of the Covered Tax Agreement (or that would limit benefits other than a benefit under the provisions of the Cov Tax Agreement relating to residence, associated enterprises or non-discrimination or a benefits is not restricted solely to residents of a Contracting Jurisdiction) only to a resident that qualifor such benefits by meeting one or more categorical tests.

15. A Party may reserve the right:

- a) for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements on the basis that it inter adopt a combination of a detailed limitation on benefits provision and either rules to address conduit financing structures or a principal purpose test, thereby meeting the minimum standard for preventing treaty abuse under the OECD/G20 BEPS package such cases, the Contracting Jurisdictions shall endeavour to reach a mutually satisfa solution which meets the minimum standard;
- b) for paragraph 1 (and paragraph 4, in the case of a Party that has chosen to apply that paragraph) not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain provision that deny all of the benefits that would otherwise be provided under the Covered Tax Agreement where the principal purpose or one of the principal purposes of any arrangement or transaction, or of any person concerned with an arrangement or transaction, was to obtain those benefits;
- c) for the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain the provisions described in paragraph 14.

16. Except where the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision applies with respect to granting of benefits under a Covered Tax Agreement by one or more Parties pursuant to para 7, a Party that chooses pursuant to paragraph 6 to apply the Simplified Limitation on Benefit Provision may reserve the right for the entirety of this Article not to apply with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements for which one or more of the other Contracting Jurisdictions has n chosen to apply the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision. In such cases, the Contract Jurisdictions shall endeavour to reach a mutually satisfactory solution which meets the mini standard for preventing treaty abuse under the OECD/G20 BEPS package.

17. a) Each Party that has not made the reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragraph 15 shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements that is not subject to a reservation described in subparagraph b) (paragraph 15 contains a provision described in paragraph 2, and if so, the art and paragraph number of each such provision. Where all Contracting Jurisdie have made such a notification with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement, that provision shall be replaced by the provisions of paragraph 1 where applicable, paragraph 4). In other cases, paragraph 1 (and where applied paragraph 4) shall supersede the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement o the extent that those provisions are incompatible with paragraph 1 (and when applicable, paragraph 4). A Party making a notification under this subparagra may also include a statement that while such Party accepts the application of paragraph 1 alone as an interim measure, it intends where possible to adopt a limitation on benefits provision, in addition to or in replacement of paragraph through bilateral negotiation. Each Party that chooses to apply paragraph 4 shall notify the Depositary of its choice b) Paragraph 4 shall apply to a Covered Tax Agreement only where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification. Each Party that chooses to apply the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision pu c) to paragraph 6 shall notify the Depositary of its choice. Unless such Party has made reservation described in subparagraph c) of paragraph 15, such notification shall als include the list of its Covered Tax Agreements which contain a provision described paragraph 14, as well as the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Each Party that does not choose to apply the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Prov d) pursuant to paragraph 6, but chooses to apply either subparagraph a) or b) of paragr shall notify the Depositary of its choice of subparagraph. Unless such Party has made reservation described in subparagraph c) of paragraph 15, such notification shall als include the list of its Covered Tax Agreements which contain a provision described paragraph 14, as well as the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made a notification under subparagraph c) e) with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement, that provision shall be rep by the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision. In other cases, the Simplified Limitation on Benefits Provision shall supersede the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent that those provisions are incompatible with the Simpl Limitation on Benefits Provision.

Article 8

Dividend Transfer Transactions

1. Provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that exempt dividends paid by a company is a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction from tax or that limit the rate at which such divide may be taxed, provided that the beneficial owner or the recipient is a company which is a reof the other Contracting Jurisdiction and which owns, holds or controls more than a certain amount of the capital, shares, stock, voting power, voting rights or similar ownership interess the company paying the dividends, shall apply only if the ownership conditions described in provisions are met throughout a 365 day period that includes the day of the payment of the dividends (for the purpose of computing that period, no account shall be taken of changes of ownership that would directly result from a corporate reorganisation, such as a merger or div reorganisation, of the company that holds the shares or that pays the dividends).

2. The minimum holding period provided in paragraph 1 shall apply in place of or in t absence of a minimum holding period in provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement described paragraph 1.

A Party may reserve the right:

3.

- a) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
- b) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements to the ext that the provisions described in paragraph 1 already include:
 - i) a minimum holding period;
 - ii) a minimum holding period shorter than a 365 day period; or
 - iii) a minimum holding period longer than a 365 day period.

4. Each Party that has not made a reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragraph shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements contains a provise described in paragraph 1 that is not subject to a reservation described in subparagraph b) of paragraph 3, and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Paragraph 1 apply with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement only where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification with respect to that provision.

Article 9

Capital Gains from Alienation of Shares or Interests of Entities Deriving their Va Principally from Immovable Property

1. Provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement providing that gains derived by a resident of Contracting Jurisdiction from the alienation of shares or other rights of participation in an er may be taxed in the other Contracting Jurisdiction provided that these shares or rights derived more than a certain part of their value from immovable property (real property) situated in the 2. The period provided in subparagraph a) of paragraph 1 shall apply in place of or in absence of a time period for determining whether the relevant value threshold in provisions Covered Tax Agreement described in paragraph 1 was met.

3. A Party may also choose to apply paragraph 4 with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements.

4. For purposes of a Covered Tax Agreement, gains derived by a resident of a Contrac Jurisdiction from the alienation of shares or comparable interests, such as interests in a partr or trust, may be taxed in the other Contracting Jurisdiction if, at any time during the 365 day preceding the alienation, these shares or comparable interests derived more than 50 per cent their value directly or indirectly from immovable property (real property) situated in that oth Contracting Jurisdiction.

5. Paragraph 4 shall apply in place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement providing that gains derived by a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction from the alienation of shares or other rights of participation in an entity may be taxed in the other Contracting Jurisdiction provided that these shares or rights derived more than a certain part their value from immovable property (real property) situated in that other Contracting Jurisd or provided that more than a certain part of the property of the entity consists of such immov property (real property).

6. A Party may reserve the right:

- a) for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
- b) for subparagraph a) of paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
- c) for subparagraph b) of paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
- d) for subparagraph a) of paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain a provision of the type described in paragraph 1 that includes a peri determining whether the relevant value threshold was met;
- e) for subparagraph b) of paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain a provision of the type described in paragraph 1 that applies to the alienation of interests other than shares;
- f) for paragraph 4 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain the provisions described in paragraph 5.

7. Each Party that has not made the reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragr shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements contains a provis described in paragraph 1, and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision Paragraph 1 shall apply with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement only where Contracting Jurisdictions have made a notification with respect to that provision.

8. Each Party that chooses to apply paragraph 4 shall notify the Depositary of its choice Paragraph 4 shall apply to a Covered Tax Agreement only where all Contracting Jurisdiction have made such a notification. In such case, paragraph 1 shall not apply with respect to that Covered Tax Agreement. In the case of a Party that has not made the reservation described is subparagraph f) of paragraph 6 and has made the reservation described in subparagraph a) o paragraph 6, such notification shall also include the list of its Covered Tax Agreements whice contain a provision described in paragraph 5, as well as the article and paragraph number of such provision. Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made a notification with respect to provision of a Covered Tax Agreement under this paragraph or paragraph 7, that provision s be replaced by the provisions of paragraph 4. In other cases, paragraph 4 shall supersede the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent that those provisions are incom with paragraph 4.

Article 10

Anti-abuse Rule for Permanent Establishments Situated in Third Jurisdictions

1. Where:

- a) an enterprise of a Contracting Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement derives incomposition from the other Contracting Jurisdiction and the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction treats such income as attributable to a permanent establishment of the enterprise situation in a third jurisdiction; and
- b) the profits attributable to that permanent establishment are exempt from tax in the f mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction,

the benefits of the Covered Tax Agreement shall not apply to any item of income of which the tax in the third jurisdiction is less than 60 per cent of the tax that would be imposed in the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction on that item of income if the permanent establishment were situated in the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdicti such a case, any income to which the provisions of this paragraph apply shall remain taxable according to the domestic law of the other Contracting Jurisdiction, notwithstanding any other provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement. 2. Paragraph 1 shall not apply if the income derived from the other Contracting Jurisd described in paragraph 1 is derived in connection with or is incidental to the active conduct obusiness carried on through the permanent establishment (other than the business of making managing or simply holding investments for the enterprise's own account, unless these activate banking, insurance or securities activities carried on by a bank, insurance enterprise or registered securities dealer, respectively).

3. If benefits under a Covered Tax Agreement are denied pursuant to paragraph 1 with respect to an item of income derived by a resident of a Contracting Jurisdiction, the competer authority of the other Contracting Jurisdiction may, nevertheless, grant these benefits with reto that item of income if, in response to a request by such resident, such competent authority determines that granting such benefits is justified in light of the reasons such resident did no satisfy the requirements of paragraphs 1 and 2. The competent authority of the Contracting Jurisdiction to which a request has been made under the preceding sentence by a resident of other Contracting Jurisdiction shall consult with the competent authority of that other Contracting Jurisdiction before either granting or denying the request.

4. Paragraphs 1 through 3 shall apply in place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that deny or limit benefits that would otherwise be granted to an enterprise of a Contracting Jurisdiction which derives income from the other Contracting Jurisdiction that is attributable to a permanent establishment of the enterprise situated in a th jurisdiction.

- 5. A Party may reserve the right:
 - a) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
 - b) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that alrea contain the provisions described in paragraph 4;
 - c) for this Article to apply only to its Covered Tax Agreements that already contain the provisions described in paragraph 4.

6. Each Party that has not made the reservation described in subparagraph a) or b) of paragraph 5 shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements con provision described in paragraph 4, and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification with respect to provision of a Covered Tax Agreement, that provision shall be replaced by the provisions of paragraphs 1 through 3. In other cases, paragraphs 1 through 3 shall supersede the provision the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent that those provisions are incompatible with the paragraphs.

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Article 11

Application of Tax Agreements to Restrict a Party's Right to Tax its Own Reside

1. A Covered Tax Agreement shall not affect the taxation by a Contracting Jurisdiction residents, except with respect to the benefits granted under provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement:

- a) which require that Contracting Jurisdiction to grant to an enterprise of that Contract Jurisdiction a correlative or corresponding adjustment following an initial adjustme made by the other Contracting Jurisdiction, in accordance with the Covered Tax Agreement, to the amount of tax charged in the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdic on the profits of a permanent establishment of the enterprise or the profits of an asso enterprise;
- b) which may affect how that Contracting Jurisdiction taxes an individual who is a res of that Contracting Jurisdiction if that individual derives income in respect of servic rendered to the other Contracting Jurisdiction or a political subdivision or local auth or other comparable body thereof;
- which may affect how that Contracting Jurisdiction taxes an individual who is a res
 of that Contracting Jurisdiction if that individual is also a student, business apprenti
 trainee, or a teacher, professor, lecturer, instructor, researcher or research scholar w
 meets the conditions of the Covered Tax Agreement;
- d) which require that Contracting Jurisdiction to provide a tax credit or tax exemption residents of that Contracting Jurisdiction with respect to the income that the other Contracting Jurisdiction may tax in accordance with the Covered Tax Agreement (including profits that are attributable to a permanent establishment situated in that Contracting Jurisdiction in accordance with the Covered Tax Agreement);
- e) which protect residents of that Contracting Jurisdiction against certain discriminator taxation practices by that Contracting Jurisdiction;
- f) which allow residents of that Contracting Jurisdiction to request that the competent authority of that or either Contracting Jurisdiction consider cases of taxation not in accordance with the Covered Tax Agreement;
- g) which may affect how that Contracting Jurisdiction taxes an individual who is a res of that Contracting Jurisdiction when that individual is a member of a diplomatic m government mission or consular post of the other Contracting Jurisdiction;
- which provide that pensions or other payments made under the social security legisl of the other Contracting Jurisdiction shall be taxable only in that other Contracting Jurisdiction;
- which provide that pensions and similar payments, annuities, alimony payments or maintenance payments arising in the other Contracting Jurisdiction shall be taxable in that other Contracting Jurisdiction; or
- which otherwise expressly limit a Contracting Jurisdiction's right to tax its own rest or provide expressly that the Contracting Jurisdiction in which an item of income ar

 Paragraph 1 shall apply in place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement stating that the Covered Tax Agreement would not affect the taxation by a Contr Jurisdiction of its residents.

- 3. A Party may reserve the right:
 - a) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
 - b) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements that alrea contain the provisions described in paragraph 2.

4. Each Party that has not made the reservation described in subparagraph a) or b) of paragraph 3 shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements con provision described in paragraph 2, and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification with respect to provision of a Covered Tax Agreement, that provision shall be replaced by the provisions of paragraph 1. In other cases, paragraph 1 shall supersede the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent that those provisions are incompatible with paragraph 1.

Part IV. Avoidance of Permanent Establishment Status

Article 12

Artificial Avoidance of Permanent Establishment Status through Commissionnal Arrangements and Similar Strategies

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that define the term "permanent establishment", but subject to paragraph 2, where a person is acting in a Contract Jurisdiction to a Covered Tax Agreement on behalf of an enterprise and, in doing so, habitual concludes contracts, or habitually plays the principal role leading to the conclusion of contract that are routinely concluded without material modification by the enterprise, and these contracts are:

a) in the name of the enterprise; or

b) for the transfer of the ownership of, or for the granting of the right to use, property owned by that enterprise or that the enterprise has the right to use; or

c) for the provision of services by that enterprise,

that enterprise shall be deemed to have a permanent establishment in that Contractin Jurisdiction in respect of any activities which that person undertakes for the enterpriunless these activities, if they were exercised by the enterprise through a fixed place business of that enterprise situated in that Contracting Jurisdiction, would not cause fixed place of business to be deemed to constitute a permanent establishment under definition of permanent establishment included in the Covered Tax Agreement (as is be modified by this Convention). 2. Paragraph 1 shall not apply where the person acting in a Contracting Jurisdiction to Covered Tax Agreement on behalf of an enterprise of the other Contracting Jurisdiction carr business in the first-mentioned Contracting Jurisdiction as an independent agent and acts for enterprise in the ordinary course of that business. Where, however, a person acts exclusively almost exclusively on behalf of one or more enterprises to which it is closely related, that per shall not be considered to be an independent agent within the meaning of this paragraph with respect to any such enterprise.

3. a) Paragraph 1 shall apply in place of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement to describe the conditions under which an enterprise shall be deemed to have a permanent establishment in a Contracting Jurisdiction (or a person shall be do to be a permanent establishment in a Contracting Jurisdiction) in respect of a activity which a person other than an agent of an independent status undertak the enterprise, but only to the extent that such provisions address the situation which such person has, and habitually exercises, in that Contracting Jurisdict authority to conclude contracts in the name of the enterprise.

b) Paragraph 2 shall apply in place of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreemen provide that an enterprise shall not be deemed to have a permanent establishment in Contracting Jurisdiction in respect of an activity which an agent of an independent s undertakes for the enterprise.

 A Party may reserve the right for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Cove Tax Agreements.

5. Each Party that has not made a reservation described in paragraph 4 shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements contains a provision described is subparagraph a) of paragraph 3, as well as the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Paragraph 1 shall apply with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made a notification with respect to that provision.

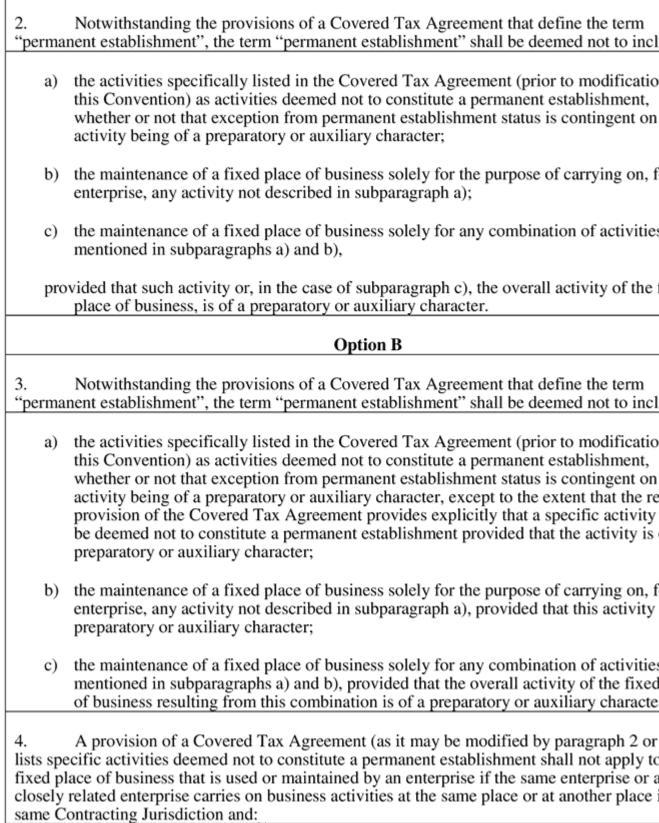

Artificial Avoidance of Permanent Establishment Status through the Specific Acti Exemptions

1. For the sole purpose of determining whether the period (or periods) referred to in a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement that stipulates a period (or periods) of time after whi specific projects or activities shall constitute a permanent establishment has been exceeded:

- a) where an enterprise of a Contracting Jurisdiction carries on activities in the other Contracting Jurisdiction at a place that constitutes a building site, construction project installation project or other specific project identified in the relevant provision of th Covered Tax Agreement, or carries on supervisory or consultancy activities in conn with such a place, in the case of a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement that refers such activities, and these activities are carried on during one or more periods of time in the aggregate, exceed 30 days without exceeding the period or periods referred to relevant provision of the Covered Tax Agreement; and
- b) where connected activities are carried on in that other Contracting Jurisdiction at (o where the relevant provision of the Covered Tax Agreement applies to supervisory consultancy activities, in connection with) the same building site, construction or installation project, or other place identified in the relevant provision of the Covered Agreement during different periods of time, each exceeding 30 days, by one or mor enterprises closely related to the first-mentioned enterprise,

these different periods of time shall be added to the aggregate period of time during wh first-mentioned enterprise has carried on activities at that building site, construction or insta project, or other place identified in the relevant provision of the Covered Tax Agreement.

2. Paragraph 1 shall apply in place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement to the extent that such provisions address the division of contracts into multiple to avoid the application of a time period or periods in relation to the existence of a permanent establishment for specific projects or activities described in paragraph 1.

- 3. A Party may reserve the right:
 - a) for the entirety of this Article not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements;
 - b) for the entirety of this Article not to apply with respect to provisions of its Covered Agreements relating to the exploration for or exploitation of natural resources.

4. Each Party that has not made a reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragraph shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements contains a provise described in paragraph 2 that is not subject to a reservation under subparagraph b) of paragraph and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement, that provision shall be replaced by the provisions of paragraph 1 to the extent provided in paragraph 2. In other cases, paragraph 1 shall supersede the provisions of the Co Tax Agreement only to the extent that those provisions are incompatible with paragraph 1.

Article 15

Definition of a Person Closely Related to an Enterprise

1. For the purposes of the provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that are modified b paragraph 2 of Article 12 (Artificial Avoidance of Permanent Establishment Status through Commissionnaire Arrangements and Similar Strategies), paragraph 4 of Article 13 (Artificia Avoidance of Permanent Establishment Status through the Specific Activity Exemptions), o paragraph 1 of Article 14 (Splitting-up of Contracts), a person is closely related to an enterp based on all the relevant facts and circumstances, one has control of the other or both are un control of the same persons or enterprises. In any case, a person shall be considered to be clearelated to an enterprise if one possesses directly or indirectly more than 50 per cent of the beneficial interest in the other (or, in the case of a company, more than 50 per cent of the company) or if another person possesses directly or indirectly more than 50 per cent of the beneficial interest (or, in the case of a company, more than 50 per cent of the aggregate vote value of the company's shares or of the beneficial equity interest in the company) in the person and the enterprise.

2. A Party that has made the reservations described in paragraph 4 of Article 12 (Artif Avoidance of Permanent Establishment Status through Commissionnaire Arrangements and Similar Strategies), subparagraph a) or c) of paragraph 6 of Article 13 (Artificial Avoidance Permanent Establishment Status through the Specific Activity Exemptions), and subparagraph of paragraph 3 of Article 14 (Splitting-up of Contracts) may reserve the right for the entirety this Article not to apply to the Covered Tax Agreements to which those reservations apply.

Part V.

Improving Dispute Resolution

Article 16

Mutual Agreement Procedure

1. Where a person considers that the actions of one or both of the Contracting Jurisdic result or will result for that person in taxation not in accordance with the provisions of the C Tax Agreement, that person may, irrespective of the remedies provided by the domestic law those Contracting Jurisdictions, present the case to the competent authority of either Contract Jurisdiction. The case must be presented within three years from the first notification of the resulting in taxation pet in accordance with the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement.

3. The competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions shall endeavour to resolv mutual agreement any difficulties or doubts arising as to the interpretation or application of Covered Tax Agreement. They may also consult together for the elimination of double taxat cases not provided for in the Covered Tax Agreement.

4. a) i) The first sentence of paragraph 1 shall apply in place of or in the a of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement (or parts thereof) that provide that where a perso considers that the actions of one or both of the Contracting Jurisdiction result or will result f person in taxation not in accordance with the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement, tha person may, irrespective of the remedies provided by the domestic law of those Contracting Jurisdiction of v that person is a resident including provisions under which, if the case presented by that person by that person of a Covered Tax Agreement relating to non-discrimination base nationality, the case may be presented to the competent authority of the Contracting Jurisdiction base nationality, the person is a national.

ii) The second sentence of paragraph 1 shall apply in place of provisions of a Covered Agreement that provide that a case referred to in the first sentence of paragraph 1 must be presented within a specific time period that is shorter than three years from the first notificat the action resulting in taxation not in accordance with the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement, or in the absence of a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement describing the tim period within which such a case must be presented.

b) i) The first sentence of paragraph 2 shall apply in the absence of provisions o Covered Tax Agreement that provide that the competent authority that is presented with the by the person referred to in paragraph 1 shall endeavour, if the objection appears to it to be justified and if it is not itself able to arrive at a satisfactory solution, to resolve the case by m agreement with the competent authority of the other Contracting Jurisdiction, with a view to avoidance of taxation which is not in accordance with the Covered Tax Agreement.

ii) The second sentence of paragraph 2 shall apply in the absence of provisions of a Co Tax Agreement providing that any agreement reached shall be implemented notwithstanding time limits in the domestic law of the Contracting Jurisdictions.

c) i) The first sentence of paragraph 3 shall apply in the absence of provisions of Covered Tax Agreement that provide that the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions shall endeavour to resolve by mutual agreement any difficulties or doubts arisi to the interpretation or application of the Covered Tax Agreement. ii) The second sentence of paragraph 3 shall apply in the absence of provisions of a Co Tax Agreement that provide that the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions r also consult together for the elimination of double taxation in cases not provided for in the Covered Tax Agreement.

5. A Party may reserve the right:

- for the first sentence of paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements on a) basis that it intends to meet the minimum standard for improving dispute resolution the OECD/G20 BEPS Package by ensuring that under each of its Covered Tax Agreements (other than a Covered Tax Agreement that permits a person to present to the competent authority of either Contracting Jurisdiction), where a person consithat the actions of one or both of the Contracting Jurisdictions result or will result for person in taxation not in accordance with the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreer irrespective of the remedies provided by the domestic law of those Contracting Jurisdictions, that person may present the case to the competent authority of the Contracting Jurisdiction of which the person is a resident or, if the case presented b person comes under a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement relating to nondiscrimination based on nationality, to that of the Contracting Jurisdiction of which person is a national; and the competent authority of that Contracting Jurisdiction with implement a bilateral notification or consultation process with the competent author the other Contracting Jurisdiction for cases in which the competent authority to whi mutual agreement procedure case was presented does not consider the taxpayer's objection to be justified;
- b) for the second sentence of paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements do not provide that the case referred to in the first sentence of paragraph 1 must be presented within a specific time period on the basis that it intends to meet the minin standard for improving dispute resolution under the OECD/G20 BEPS package by ensuring that for the purposes of all such Covered Tax Agreements the taxpayer refto in paragraph 1 is allowed to present the case within a period of at least three year the first notification of the action resulting in taxation not in accordance with the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement;
- c) for the second sentence of paragraph 2 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements basis that for the purposes of all of its Covered Tax Agreements:
 - any agreement reached via the mutual agreement procedure shall be implement notwithstanding any time limits in the domestic laws of the Contracting Jurisdie or
 - ii) it intends to meet the minimum standard for improving dispute resolution under OECD/G20 BEPS package by accepting, in its bilateral treaty negotiations, a tr provision providing that:

- A) the Contracting Jurisdictions shall make no adjustment to the profits that are attribut to a permanent establishment of an enterprise of one of the Contracting Jurisdiction a period that is mutually agreed between both Contracting Jurisdictions from the enthe taxable year in which the profits would have been attributable to the permanent establishment (this provision shall not apply in the case of fraud, gross negligence of wilful default); and
- B) the Contracting Jurisdictions shall not include in the profits of an enterprise, and tax accordingly, profits that would have accrued to the enterprise but that by reason of t conditions referred to in a provision in the Covered Tax Agreement relating to associate enterprises have not so accrued, after a period that is mutually agreed between both Contracting Jurisdictions from the end of the taxable year in which the profits would accrued to the enterprise (this provision shall not apply in the case of fraud, gross negligence or wilful default).
- 6. a) Each Party that has not made a reservation described in subparagraph a) of paragraph 5 shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements contains a provision described in clause i) of subparagraph a) of paragraph 4, and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provisio Where all Contracting Jurisdictions have made a notification with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement, that provision shall be replaced by th sentence of paragraph 1. In other cases, the first sentence of paragraph 1 shall supersede the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent th those provisions are incompatible with that sentence.
 - Each Party that has not made the reservation described in subparagraph b) of paragraph 5 shall notify the Depositary of:

a) under a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement (as it may be modified by paragraph 1 of Article 16 (Mutual Agreement Procedure)) that provides that a perso present a case to a competent authority of a Contracting Jurisdiction where that perso considers that the actions of one or both of the Contracting Jurisdictions result or we result for that person in taxation not in accordance with the provisions of the Coverd Agreement (as it may be modified by the Convention), a person has presented a case the competent authority of a Contracting Jurisdiction on the basis that the actions of or both of the Contracting Jurisdictions have resulted for that person in taxation not accordance with the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement (as it may be modified the Convention); and

b) the competent authorities are unable to reach an agreement to resolve that of pursuant to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement (as it may be modified by para 2 of Article 16 (Mutual Agreement Procedure)) that provides that the competent author shall endeavour to resolve the case by mutual agreement with the competent author the other Contracting Jurisdiction, within a period of two years beginning on the sta referred to in paragraph 8 or 9, as the case may be (unless, prior to the expiration of period the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions have agreed to a different time period with respect to that case and have notified the person who press the case of such agreement),

any unresolved issues arising from the case shall, if the person so requests in writin submitted to arbitration in the manner described in this Part, according to any rules procedures agreed upon by the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdiction pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 10.

2. Where a competent authority has suspended the mutual agreement procedure referred in paragraph 1 because a case with respect to one or more of the same issues is pending befor court or administrative tribunal, the period provided in subparagraph b) of paragraph 1 will s running until either a final decision has been rendered by the court or administrative tribunal case has been suspended or withdrawn. In addition, where a person who presented a case an competent authority have agreed to suspend the mutual agreement procedure, the period pro in subparagraph b) of paragraph 1 will stop running until the suspension has been lifted.

3. Where both competent authorities agree that a person directly affected by the case h failed to provide in a timely manner any additional material information requested by either competent authority after the start of the period provided in subparagraph b) of paragraph 1, period provided in subparagraph b) of paragraph 1 shall be extended for an amount of time of to the period beginning on the date by which the information was requested and ending on the on which that information was provided.

4. a) The arbitration decision with respect to the issues submitted to arbitration s be implemented through the mutual agreement concerning the case referred to in paragraph arbitration decision shall be final.

b) The arbitration decision shall be binding on both Contracting Jurisdictions except in following cases:

- i) if a person directly affected by the case does not accept the mutual agreement the implements the arbitration decision. In such a case, the case shall not be eligible any further consideration by the competent authorities. The mutual agreement to implements the arbitration decision on the case shall be considered not to be accessed by a person directly affected by the case if any person directly affected by the case if any person directly affected by the consideration of the mutual agreement is sent to the person, withdraw all issues resolved in the mutual agreement implementing the arbitration decision from consideration by any court or administrative tribunal or otherwise terminate any pending court or administrative agreement.
- ii) if a final decision of the courts of one of the Contracting Jurisdictions holds tha arbitration decision is invalid. In such a case, the request for arbitration under paragraph 1 shall be considered not to have been made, and the arbitration proc shall be considered not to have taken place (except for the purposes of Articles (Confidentiality of Arbitration Proceedings) and 25 (Costs of Arbitration Proceedings)). In such a case, a new request for arbitration may be made unless competent authorities agree that such a new request should not be permitted.
- iii) if a person directly affected by the case pursues litigation on the issues which we resolved in the mutual agreement implementing the arbitration decision in any or administrative tribunal.

5. The competent authority that received the initial request for a mutual agreement procedure as described in subparagraph a) of paragraph 1 shall, within two calendar months receiving the request:

- a) send a notification to the person who presented the case that it has received the required and
- send a notification of that request, along with a copy of the request, to the competer authority of the other Contracting Jurisdiction.

6. Within three calendar months after a competent authority receives the request for a mutual agreement procedure (or a copy thereof from the competent authority of the other Contracting Jurisdiction) it shall either:

 a) notify the person who has presented the case and the other competent authority that received the information necessary to undertake substantive consideration of the case

b) request additional information from that person for that purpose.

a) that it has received the requested information; or

b) that some of the requested information is still missing.

8. Where neither competent authority has requested additional information pursuant to subparagraph b) of paragraph 6, the start date referred to in paragraph 1 shall be the earlier of

- a) the date on which both competent authorities have notified the person who presente case pursuant to subparagraph a) of paragraph 6; and
- b) the date that is three calendar months after the notification to the competent authorit the other Contracting Jurisdiction pursuant to subparagraph b) of paragraph 5.

9. Where additional information has been requested pursuant to subparagraph b) of paragraph 6, the start date referred to in paragraph 1 shall be the earlier of:

- a) the latest date on which the competent authorities that requested additional informat have notified the person who presented the case and the other competent authority pursuant to subparagraph a) of paragraph 7; and
- b) the date that is three calendar months after both competent authorities have received information requested by either competent authority from the person who presented case.

If, however, one or both of the competent authorities send the notification referred subparagraph b) of paragraph 7, such notification shall be treated as a request for add information under subparagraph b) of paragraph 6.

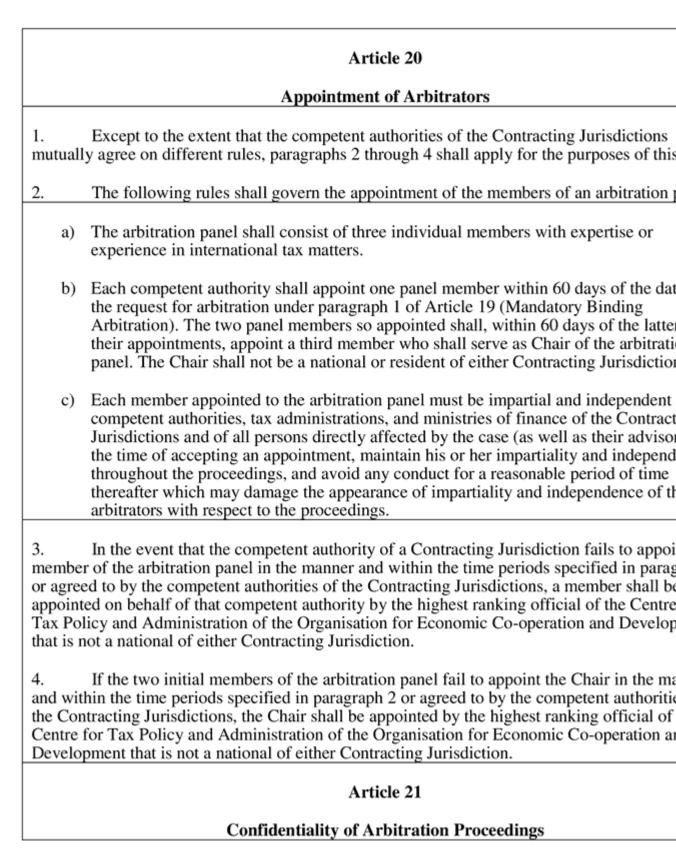
10. The competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions shall by mutual agreeme (pursuant to the article of the relevant Covered Tax Agreement regarding procedures for mu agreement) settle the mode of application of the provisions contained in this Part, including minimum information necessary for each competent authority to undertake substantive consideration of the case. Such an agreement shall be concluded before the date on which unresolved issues in a case are first eligible to be submitted to arbitration and may be modifi from time to time thereafter.

11. For purposes of applying this Article to its Covered Tax Agreements, a Party may r the right to replace the two-year period set forth in subparagraph b) of paragraph 1 with a th year period.

12. A Party may reserve the right for the following rules to apply with respect to its Co Tax Agreements notwithstanding the other provisions of this Article:

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 any unresolved issue arising from a mutual agreement procedure case otherwise with the scope of the arbitration process provided for by this Convention shall not be sub to arbitration, if a decision on this issue has already been rendered by a court or administrative tribunal of either Contracting Jurisdiction;



1. Solely for the purposes of the application of the provisions of this Part and of the provisions of the relevant Covered Tax Agreement and of the domestic laws of the Contract Jurisdictions related to the exchange of information, confidentiality, and administrative assist members of the arbitration panel and a maximum of three staff per member (and prospective arbitrators solely to the extent necessary to verify their ability to fulfil the requirements of arbitrators) shall be considered to be persons or authorities to whom information may be dis Information received by the arbitration panel or prospective arbitrators and information that competent authorities receive from the arbitration panel shall be considered information that exchanged under the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement related to the exchange of information and administrative assistance.

2. The competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions shall ensure that member the arbitration panel and their staff agree in writing, prior to their acting in an arbitration proceeding, to treat any information relating to the arbitration proceeding consistently with t confidentiality and nondisclosure obligations described in the provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement related to exchange of information and administrative assistance and under the applicable laws of the Contracting Jurisdictions.

Article 22

Resolution of a Case Prior to the Conclusion of the Arbitration

For the purposes of this Part and the provisions of the relevant Covered Tax Agreeme provide for resolution of cases through mutual agreement, the mutual agreement proced well as the arbitration proceeding, with respect to a case shall terminate if, at any time request for arbitration has been made and before the arbitration panel has delivered its deci the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions:

- a) the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions reach a mutual agreement resolve the case; or
- b) the person who presented the case withdraws the request for arbitration or the reque a mutual agreement procedure.

Article 23

Type of Arbitration Process

1. Except to the extent that the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions mutually agree on different rules, the following rules shall apply with respect to an arbitratic proceeding pursuant to this Part:

- a) After a case is submitted to arbitration, the competent authority of each Contracting Jurisdiction shall submit to the arbitration panel, by a date set by agreement, a proper resolution which addresses all unresolved issue(s) in the case (taking into account a agreements previously reached in that case between the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions). The proposed resolution shall be limited to a disposition specific monetary amounts (for example, of income or expense) or, where specified maximum rate of tax charged pursuant to the Covered Tax Agreement, for each adjustment or similar issue in the case. In a case in which the competent authorities Contracting Jurisdictions have been unable to reach agreement on an issue regarding conditions for application of a provision of the relevant Covered Tax Agreement (hereinafter referred to as a "threshold question"), such as whether an individual is a resident or whether a permanent establishment exists, the competent authorities may submit alternative proposed resolutions with respect to issues the determination of v is contingent on resolution of such threshold questions.
- b) The competent authority of each Contracting Jurisdiction may also submit a support position paper for consideration by the arbitration panel. Each competent authority is submits a proposed resolution or supporting position paper shall provide a copy to t other competent authority by the date on which the proposed resolution and support position paper were due. Each competent authority may also submit to the arbitratic panel, by a date set by agreement, a reply submission with respect to the proposed resolution and supporting position paper submitted by the other competent authority copy of any reply submission shall be provided to the other competent authority by date on which the reply submission was due.
- c) The arbitration panel shall select as its decision one of the proposed resolutions for case submitted by the competent authorities with respect to each issue and any three questions, and shall not include a rationale or any other explanation of the decision. arbitration decision will be adopted by a simple majority of the panel members. The arbitration panel shall deliver its decision in writing to the competent authorities of Contracting Jurisdictions. The arbitration decision shall have no precedential value.

2. For the purpose of applying this Article with respect to its Covered Tax Agreement Party may reserve the right for paragraph 1 not to apply to its Covered Tax Agreements. In s case, except to the extent that the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions mut agree on different rules, the following rules shall apply with respect to an arbitration proceed

- a) After a case is submitted to arbitration, the competent authority of each Contracting Jurisdiction shall provide any information that may be necessary for the arbitration decision to all panel members without undue delay. Unless the competent authoritie the Contracting Jurisdictions agree otherwise, any information that was not availabl both competent authorities before the request for arbitration was received by both o shall not be taken into account for purposes of the decision.
- b) The arbitration panel shall decide the issues submitted to arbitration in accordance w the applicable provisions of the Covered Tax Agreement and, subject to these provi of those of the domestic laws of the Contracting Jurisdictions. The panel members s also consider any other sources which the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions may by mutual agreement expressly identify.
- c) The arbitration decision shall be delivered to the competent authorities of the Contra Jurisdictions in writing and shall indicate the sources of law relied upon and the rea which led to its result. The arbitration decision shall be adopted by a simple majorit the panel members. The arbitration decision shall have no precedential value.

3. A Party that has not made the reservation described in paragraph 2 may reserve the for the preceding paragraphs of this Article not to apply with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements with Parties that have made such a reservation. In such a case, the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions of each such Covered Tax Agreement shall ender to reach agreement on the type of arbitration process that shall apply with respect to that Co Tax Agreement. Until such an agreement is reached, Article 19 (Mandatory Binding Arbitra shall not apply with respect to such a Covered Tax Agreement.

4. A Party may also choose to apply paragraph 5 with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements and shall notify the Depositary accordingly. Paragraph 5 shall apply in relation Contracting Jurisdictions with respect to a Covered Tax Agreement where either of the Contracting Jurisdictions has made such a notification.

5. Prior to the beginning of arbitration proceedings, the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions to a Covered Tax Agreement shall ensure that each person that pre the case and their advisors agree in writing not to disclose to any other person any informative received during the course of the arbitration proceedings from either competent authority or arbitration panel. The mutual agreement procedure under the Covered Tax Agreement, as we the arbitration proceeding under this Part, with respect to the case shall terminate if, at any the after a request for arbitration has been made and before the arbitration panel has delivered it decision to the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions, a person that presente case or one of that person's advisors materially breaches that agreement.

6. Notwithstanding paragraph 4, a Party that does not choose to apply paragraph 5 ma reserve the right for paragraph 5 not to apply with respect to one or more identified Covered Agreements or with respect to all of its Covered Tax Agreements.

7. A Party that chooses to apply paragraph 5 may reserve the right for this Part not to a with respect to all Covered Tax Agreements for which the other Contracting Jurisdiction mareservation pursuant to paragraph 6.

Article 24

Agreement on a Different Resolution

1. For purposes of applying this Part with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements, a Pa may choose to apply paragraph 2 and shall notify the Depositary accordingly. Paragraph 2 s apply in relation to two Contracting Jurisdictions with respect to a Covered Tax Agreement where both Contracting Jurisdictions have made such a notification.

2. Notwithstanding paragraph 4 of Article 19 (Mandatory Binding Arbitration), an arbitration decision pursuant to this Part shall not be binding on the Contracting Jurisdiction Covered Tax Agreement and shall not be implemented if the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdictions agree on a different resolution of all unresolved issues within three calendar months after the arbitration decision has been delivered to them.

 A Party that chooses to apply paragraph 2 may reserve the right for paragraph 2 to a only with respect to its Covered Tax Agreements for which paragraph 2 of Article 23 (Type Arbitration Process) applies.

Article 25

Costs of Arbitration Proceedings

In an arbitration proceeding under this Part, the fees and expenses of the members arbitration panel, as well as any costs incurred in connection with the arbitration proceeding the Contracting Jurisdictions, shall be borne by the Contracting Jurisdictions in a manner settled by mutual agreement between the competent authorities of the Contracting Jurisdiction the absence of such agreement, each Contracting Jurisdiction shall bear its own expense those of its appointed panel member. The cost of the chair of the arbitration panel and expenses associated with the conduct of the arbitration proceedings shall be borne Contracting Jurisdictions in equal shares.

Article 26

Compatibility

1. Subject to Article 18 (Choice to Apply Part VI), the provisions of this Part shall app place of or in the absence of provisions of a Covered Tax Agreement that provide for arbitra unresolved issues arising from a mutual agreement procedure case. Each Party that chooses apply this Part shall notify the Depositary of whether each of its Covered Tax Agreements, of than those that are within the scope of a reservation under paragraph 4, contains such a prov and if so, the article and paragraph number of each such provision. Where two Contracting Jurisdictions have made a notification with respect to a provision of a Covered Tax Agreement that provision shall be replaced by the provisions of this Part as between those Contracting Jurisdictions.

2. Any unresolved issue arising from a mutual agreement procedure case otherwise with the scope of the arbitration process provided for in this Part shall not be submitted to arbitration the issue falls within the scope of a case with respect to which an arbitration panel or similar has previously been set up in accordance with a bilateral or multilateral convention that provide for mandatory binding arbitration of unresolved issues arising from a mutual agreement processe.

3. Subject to paragraph 1, nothing in this Part shall affect the fulfilment of wider oblig with respect to the arbitration of unresolved issues arising in the context of a mutual agreem procedure resulting from other conventions to which the Contracting Jurisdictions are or wil become parties.

4. A Party may reserve the right for this Part not to apply with respect to one or more identified Covered Tax Agreements (or to all of its Covered Tax Agreements) that already p for mandatory binding arbitration of unresolved issues arising from a mutual agreement processe.

Part VII.

Final Provisions

Article 27

Signature and Ratification, Acceptance or Approval

The Conference of the Parties shall be served by the Depositary.

3. Any Party may request a Conference of the Parties by communicating a request to t Depositary. The Depositary shall inform all Parties of any request. Thereafter, the Depositar convene a Conference of the Parties, provided that the request is supported by one-third of the Parties within six calendar months of the communication by the Depositary of the request.

Article 32

Interpretation and Implementation

1. Any question arising as to the interpretation or implementation of provisions of a C Tax Agreement as they are modified by this Convention shall be determined in accordance of the provision(s) of the Covered Tax Agreement relating to the resolution by mutual agreement questions of interpretation or application of the Covered Tax Agreement (as those provision be modified by this Convention).

2. Any question arising as to the interpretation or implementation of this Convention r addressed by a Conference of the Parties convened in accordance with paragraph 3 of Articl (Conference of the Parties).

Article 33

Amendment

1. Any Party may propose an amendment to this Convention by submitting the propose amendment to the Depositary.

2. A Conference of the Parties may be convened to consider the proposed amendment accordance with paragraph 3 of Article 31 (Conference of the Parties).

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Article 34

Entry into Force

1. This Convention shall enter into force on the first day of the month following the expiration of a period of three calendar months beginning on the date of deposit of the fifth instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval.

2. For each Signatory ratifying, accepting, or approving this Convention after the depo the fifth instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval, the Convention shall enter into fo the first day of the month following the expiration of a period of three calendar months begi on the date of the deposit by such Signatory of its instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval.

Article 35

Entry into Effect

 The provisions of this Convention shall have effect in each Contracting Jurisdiction respect to a Covered Tax Agreement:

Contra	Notwithstanding paragraph 9 of Article 28 (Reservations), paragraph 6 of Article 29 cations), and paragraphs 1 through 6 of Article 35 (Entry into Effect), with respect to cting Jurisdictions to a Covered Tax Agreement, the provisions of Part VI (Arbitrationa) are effect:
a)	with respect to cases presented to the competent authority of a Contracting Jurisdict described in subparagraph a) of paragraph 1 of Article 19 (Mandatory Binding Arbitration)), on or after the later of the dates on which this Convention enters into for each of the Contracting Jurisdictions to the Covered Tax Agreement; and
b)	with respect to cases presented to the competent authority of a Contracting Jurisdict prior to the later of the dates on which this Convention enters into force for each of

according to the terms of that mutual agreement.

2. A Party may reserve the right for Part VI (Arbitration) to apply to a case presented to competent authority of a Contracting Jurisdiction prior to the later of the dates on which this Convention enters into force for each of the Contracting Jurisdictions to the Covered Tax Agreement only to the extent that the competent authorities of both Contracting Jurisdiction that it will apply to that specific case.

3. In the case of a new Covered Tax Agreement resulting from an extension pursuant paragraph 5 of Article 29 (Notifications) of the list of agreements notified under clause ii) of subparagraph a) of paragraph 1 of Article 2 (Interpretation of Terms), the references in paragraph 1 and 2 of this Article to "the later of the dates on which this Convention enters into force for of the Contracting Jurisdictions to the Covered Tax Agreement" shall be replaced with refer to "the date of the communication by the Depositary of the notification of the extension of the of agreements".

4. A withdrawal or replacement of a reservation made under paragraph 4 of Article 26 (Compatibility) pursuant to paragraph 9 of Article 28 (Reservations), or the withdrawal of a objection to a reservation made under paragraph 2 of Article 28 (Reservations) which results application of Part VI (Arbitration) between two Contracting Jurisdictions to a Covered Tax Agreement, shall have effect according to subparagraphs a) and b) of paragraph 1 of this Art except that the references to "the later of the dates on which this Convention enters into force each of the Contracting Jurisdictions to the Covered Tax Agreement" shall be replaced with references to "the date of the communication by the Depositary of the notification of withdrawal of the reservation", "the date of the communication by the Depositary of the notification of replacement of the reservation" or "the date of the communication by the Depositary of the notification of the notification of the objection to the reservation", respectively.

5. An additional notification made pursuant to subparagraph p) of paragraph 1 of Artic (Notifications) shall have effect according to subparagraphs a) and b) of paragraph 1, except the references in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Article to "the later of the dates on which this Convention enters into force for each of the Contracting Jurisdictions to the Covered Tax Agreement" shall be replaced with references to "the date of the communication by the Dep of the additional notification".

Article 37

Withdrawal

1. Any Party may, at any time, withdraw from this Convention by means of a notificat addressed to the Depositary.

2. Withdrawal pursuant to paragraph 1 shall become effective on the date of receipt of notification by the Depositary. In cases where this Convention has entered into force with re to all Contracting Jurisdictions to a Covered Tax Agreement before the date on which a Part withdrawal becomes effective, that Covered Tax Agreement shall remain as modified by thi Convention.

Article 38

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1. This Convention may be supplemented by one or more protocols.

2. In order to become a party to a protocol, a State or jurisdiction must also be a Party Convention.

3. A Party to this Convention is not bound by a protocol unless it becomes a party to the protocol in accordance with its provisions.

Article 39

Depositary

1. The Secretary-General of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Develop shall be the Depositary of this Convention and any protocols pursuant to Article 38 (Relation Protocols).

- 2. The Depositary shall notify the Parties and Signatories within one calendar month of
 - any signature pursuant to Article 27 (Signature and Ratification, Acceptance or Approval);
 - b) the deposit of any instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval pursuant to Art (Signature and Ratification, Acceptance or Approval);
 - any reservation or withdrawal or replacement of a reservation pursuant to Article 28 (Reservations);
 - d) any notification or additional notification pursuant to Article 29 (Notifications);
 - e) any proposed amendment to this Convention pursuant to Article 33 (Amendment);
 - f) any withdrawal from this Convention pursuant to Article 37 (Withdrawal); and
 - g) any other communication related to this Convention.
- 3. The Depositary shall maintain publicly available lists of:
 - a) Covered Tax Agreements;
 - b) reservations made by the Parties; and
 - c) notifications made by the Parties.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

The Schedule to the Order contains an Agreement ("the Arrangements") between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and 77 other jurisdictions to implement tax treaty related measures to prevent base erosion and profit shifting. The Order brings the Arrangements into effect.

The Arrangements aim to prevent base erosion and profit shifting through the abuse of tax treaties. This is done by modifying tax treaties between the signatories in order to implement recommendations resulting from the OECD/G20 Base Erosion and Profit Shifting project.

Article 1 provides for citation.

Article 2 makes a declaration as to the effect and content of the Arrangements.

The Arrangements will enter into force on the first day of the month following the expiration of a period of three calendar months beginning on the date of deposit of the fifth instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval. For each Signatory ratifying, accepting, or approving the Arrangements after the deposit of the fifth instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval, the Arrangements shall enter into force on the first day of the month following the expiration of a period of three calendar months beginning on the date of the deposit by such Signatory of its instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval.

The Arrangements will take effect in accordance with the provisions of Article 35 of the Arrangements.

The date of entry into force will, in due course, be published in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes.

A Tax Information and Impact Note has not been produced for the Order as it modifies the effect of double taxation agreement. Double taxation agreements impose no obligations on taxpayers, rather they seek to eliminate double taxation and fiscal evasion.
