**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal Air Force  
Cosford) Regulations 2022**

*Made* - - - - *8th April 2022*

*Coming into force* - - *10th June 2022*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the area specified in regulation 3 by reason of the holding of flying displays in the vicinity of Royal Air Force Cosford.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016<sup>(a)</sup>.

**Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal Air Force Cosford) Regulations 2022 and they come into force on 10th June 2022.

**Interpretation**

2. In regulation 3(2) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time<sup>(b)</sup>.

**Restricted airspace**

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (3), during the periods specified in paragraph (2) no aircraft is to fly below 5,300 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 6 nautical miles whose centre is at 523824N 0021819W.

(2) The periods referred to in paragraph (1) are—

- (a) between 1300 hours and 1700 hours on 10th June 2022 and 11th June 2022, and
- (b) between 1000 hours and 1700 hours on 12th June 2022.

(3) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a permission issued by—

- (a) the Cosford Air Show flying display director, or
- (b) Royal Air Force Shawbury whilst under the control of the air traffic control unit at Royal Air Force Shawbury.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Royal Air Force Cosford, Shropshire during air displays that are scheduled to take place there between 10th June 2022 and 12th June 2022 (inclusive). A large number of aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(2) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(3)(a), the Cosford Air Show flying display director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
