ROAD TRAFFIC

The M42 Motorway (Junction 7a to Junction 9) and M6 Toll Motorway (M6 Junction 3a to M6 Toll Junction T1) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2022

Made - - - - *29th April 2022*
Coming into force - - *8th May 2022*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M42 Motorway (“the M42”) and the M6 Toll Motorway (“the M6 Toll”) is satisfied that traffic on lengths of those motorways, in the County of Warwickshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: –

1. This Order may be cited as the M42 Motorway (Junction 7a to Junction 9) and M6 Toll Motorway (M6 Junction 3a to M6 Toll Junction T1) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2022 and shall come into force on Sunday 8th May 2022.

2. In this Order–

“the motorway” means –

- (a) the northbound carriageway of the M42 from a point 400 metres north of the centreline of the B4114 Birmingham Road overbridge, to a point 80 metres north of the centreline of the Marsh Lane overbridge; and
- (b) the northbound carriageway of the M6 Toll from the diverge with the M6 at Junction 3a to its junction with the slip road leading from the A4097 at Curdworth;

“the works period” means the period starting at 21:00 hours on Monday 9th May 2022 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle–

- (a) being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;

- (c) being used in connection with the said works; or
- (d) being driven by, or at the direction of, a traffic officer in uniform.
