CIVIL AVIATION

The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Bournemouth) Regulations 2022

Made - - - - 15th June 2022

Coming into force - - 31st August 2022

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding there of flying displays and rehearsals associated with the 2022 Bournemouth Air Festival.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Bournemouth) Regulations 2022 and they come into force on 31st August 2022.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(2) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph 3, during the periods specified in paragraph 2 no aircraft is to fly below 5,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by straight lines joining successively the following points—
 - (a) 504304N 0015636W,
 - (b) 504405N 0014703W,
 - (c) 504016N 0014604W,
 - (d) 503914N 0015537W, and
 - (e) 504304N 0015636W.
 - (2) The periods referred to in paragraph (1) are—
 - (a) between 1200 hours and 1600 hours on 31st August 2021,
 - (b) between 1000 hours and 1930 hours on each of the 3 days beginning on 1st September 2022 and ending on 3rd September 2022, and

⁽b) Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

- (c) between 1000 hours and 1700 hours on 4th September 2022.
- (3) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a permission issued by the Bournemouth Air Festival flying display director.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Bournemouth, Dorset during air displays and associated rehearsals that are scheduled to take place there from 31st August to 4th September 2022, inclusive. Many aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(2) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(3), the Bournemouth Air Show flying display director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
