CIVIL AVIATION

The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Cosby Airshow) Regulations 2022

Made - - - 29th June 2022

Coming into force - - 2nd September 2022

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding of flying displays that are scheduled to take place there.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Cosby Airshow) Regulations 2022 and they come into force on 2nd September 2022.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(2) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (3), during the periods specified in paragraph (2) no aircraft is to fly below 3,700 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3.5 nautical miles whose centre is at 523314N 0011234W.
 - (2) The periods referred to in paragraph (1) are—
 - (a) between 1700 hours and 2000 hours on 2nd September 2022,
 - (b) between 1000 hours and 1930 hours on 3rd September 2022, and
 - (c) between 1000 hours and 1700 hours on 4th September 2022.
 - (3) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft
 - (a) flying in accordance with a permission issued by the Cosby Airshow flying display director, or
 - (b) operating under a prior permission issued by the Foxlands Farm aerodrome at Cosby.

⁽b) Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity Cosby, Leicestershire during flying displays that are scheduled to take place there between 2nd September 2022 and 4th September 2022, inclusive. Many aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(2) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(3)(a), the Cosby Air Show flying display director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
