The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Birmingham) Regulations 2023

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict the flying of unmanned aircraft in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding there of Birmingham Pride.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order $2016(\mathbf{a})$.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Birmingham) Regulations 2023 and they come into force on 27th May 2023.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0600 hours on 27th May 2023 and 2300 hours on 28th May 2023 no unmanned aircraft is to fly below 900 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 0.8 nautical mile centred at 522835N 0015347W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any unmanned aircraft flying in accordance with a permission issued by the West Midlands Police Service.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on the flying of unmanned aircraft in the vicinity of Birmingham City Centre during Birmingham Pride that is scheduled to take place there on 27th May 2023 and 28th May 2023.

In view of the high visibility of this event and at the request of the West Midland Police Service, the Civil Aviation Authority and Department for Transport agree that the flying of unmanned aircraft should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety and security.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).
