**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Firth of Forth)
Regulations 2024**

Made - - - - *18th March 2024*

Coming into force - - *21st March 2024*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest and the interests of national defence to restrict the flying of unmanned aircraft in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the operations of HMS Queen Elizabeth which are due to take place there.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Firth of Forth) Regulations 2024 and they come into force on 21st March 2024.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0500 hours on 21st March 2024 and 1800 hours on 25th March 2024 no unmanned aircraft is to fly below 1,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by straight lines joining successively the following points—

- (a) 560135N 0032737W,
- (b) 560043N 0032420W,
- (c) 560146N 0032036W,
- (d) 555915N 0032045W,
- (e) 555937N 0032714W, and
- (f) 560135N 0032737W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any unmanned aircraft—

- (a) operated by or on behalf of Police Scotland,

(a) S.I. 2016/765, to which there are amendments not relevant to these Regulations.
(b) Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is the same as Greenwich Mean Time (GMT).

- (b) flying in accordance with a permission issued by the Police Scotland Aviation Safety and Security Unit, or
- (c) insofar as flying is already prohibited by the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Nuclear Installations) Regulations 2016^(a).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on the flying of unmanned aircraft in the vicinity of the Firth of Forth due to the operations of HMS Queen Elizabeth that are due to take place there on 21st March 2024 to 25th March 2024, inclusive. At the request of the Police Scotland, the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that the flying of unmanned aircraft should be restricted in the vicinity of the Firth of Forth for reasons of national defence and the public interest.

These Regulations apply except insofar as flying is already prohibited by the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Nuclear Installations) Regulations 2016 (S.I. 2016/1003) and are applicable particularly to EGR603 ROSYTH.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is the same as Greenwich Mean Time (GMT).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2)(b), the Police Scotland Aviation Safety and Security Unit may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Briefing Sheet and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
