CIVIL AVIATION

The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Eastbourne) Regulations 2024

Made - - - - 10th April 2024

Coming into force - - 15th August 2024

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding there of flying displays.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Eastbourne) Regulations 2024 and they come into force on 15th August 2024.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1100 hours and 1700 hours on each of the four days beginning on 15th August 2024 and ending on 18th August 2024 no aircraft is to fly below 5,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by straight lines joining successively the following points—
 - (a) 504506N 0000930E,
 - (b) 505038N 0001835E,
 - (c) 504619N 0002508E,
 - (d) 504047N 0001603E, and
 - (e) 504506N 0000930E.
 - (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft—
 - (a) flying in accordance with the permission of the Eastbourne International Air Show flying display director, or
 - (b) operated by or on behalf of the—

⁽b) Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

- (i) National Police Air Service,
- (ii) Helicopter Emergency Medical Services, or
- (iii) Maritime and Coastguard Agency.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Eastbourne, East Sussex during flying displays associated with the Eastbourne International Airshow that are due to take place there from 15th August 2024 to 18th August 2024 (inclusive).

Many aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2)(a), the Eastbourne International Air Show flying display director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
