Your Excellency,

1st December, 1952.

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Grand Ducal Government of Luxembourg relating to Money and Property situated in Luxembourg and the United Kingdom and subjected to Special Measures in consequence of the Enemy Occupation of Luxembourg, which was signed at London on the 11th December, 1946,(1) and to inform your Excellency that the Government of the United Kingdom consider that the purposes for which this Agreement was concluded have been achieved and that it may now be terminated.

If this view is shared by the Luxembourg Government, I have the honour to suggest that the present note and your Excellency's reply to that effect should be regarded as constituting an Agreement between our respective Governments formally terminating with effect from to-day's date the abovementioned Agreement of the 11th December, 1946.
