British Embassy, Beirut, December 10, 1953.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Lebanese Republic for Air Services between and beyond their respective territories, signed at Beirut on the 15th August, 1951,(1) and to propose on behalf of the Government of the United Kingdom that Route (I) of Section I of the Schedule to that Agreement should be amended to read as follows:—

In the English text:—

(1) London via (a) Frankfurt or Dusseldorf or Geneva or Zurich and/or Rome or Malta or Tripoli (Libya)

or (b) Frankfurt—Vienna to Beirut and thence to Tehran or to Basra (or Abadan)—Kuwait—Bahrain—Karachi and thence via intermediate points to the Far East and/or Australia.

In the Arabic text:—

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Lebanese Republic, I have the honour to suggest that this Note and your Excellency's reply in that sense should be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments, which shall enter into force immediately.
