Copenhagen, September 3, 1953.

I have the honour to propose that the Monetary Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of Denmark of the 19th of October, 1950,(1) which was reviewed last year in accordance with Article VIII of the Agreement, shall continue in force so long as bilateral balances between the United Kingdom and Denmark are settled through the European Payments Union unless the Agreement is terminated at some earlier date by notice in accordance with Article VIII thereof.

If the Government of Denmark agree to this proposal I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and your reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an Agreement between the two Governments.
